Sir,

I have the honour to address Government on the question of exemption of the undermentioned appointments in the Medical Department from the provision of article I of the Public Service Notification.

King Institute, Guindy - Overseer

The Director states that when submitting proposals in his No.R.C.2666-11/B dated 21st September 1918 for the revision of pay and designation of the Sergeant to Overseer, special mention was made that the post should be held by

"Ex."

Ex.Military Sergeants" and that this proposal was approved by Government in their order No.231 L.Mis., dated 18th February 1919. The present incumbent of the post holds military school certificate. The Director adds that the nature of Overseer's duties are such that only Ex.Army Sergeants are most suitable for the post and that no European Sergeant with the minimum general educational qualification would be forthcoming for the appointment of Overseer at the Institute even after the retirement of the present incumbent. In view of the fact that the post of Overseer will always be held by only an Ex.Army man, I agree with the Director and recommend the exclusion of the post from the operation of article 1 of the Public Service Notification.

Assistant Overseers -

There are four Assistant Overseers at the Institute in the time scale of pay of Rs.40-1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -55-1-65 each. The reasons adduced by the Director for the exclusion of these posts are that they should be held by Ex-army men, and that men of this rank with the minimum general educational qualification will not be forthcoming for these appointments. All the present incumbents of the posts are Ex.army Indian military officers - one a retired Subadar, and the other three retired Jamadars. The Director states that the duties of the senior Assistant Overseer are (1) to exercise supervision over the Institute servants and arrange their duties (2) to look after all the experimental and stock animals in the Bacteriological and Vaccine sections (3) to exercise supervision over the cultivation of sewage farm and produce. It is further reported by the Director that only a retired Subadar of the Army will be suitable for the post. The other Assistant Overseers have to do more or less similar duties, and the Director states that it is

very

very necessary that these posts should also be excluded from the operation of article I of the Public Service Notification. Considering the fact that only retired Military Officers will be appointed to the posts, and in view of the executive nature of their work i.e. supervision and control, it is recommended that these appointments may also be excluded.

(3) Mechanic - Pay Rs.125-5-175 - Assistant Mechanic - Pay Rs.60-5-100 (King Institute) - Mechanic and Driver (Government General Hospital, Madras) - Pay Rs.35-2-55 each - Driver (Government Hospital for Women and Children, Madras) Pay -Rs.35-2-55

The Director states that the present mechanic of the Institute is an Ex-Military Non-Commissioned Officer - specially selected on account of his 15 years previous practical experience in mechanical and electrical engineering. The assistant mechanic has been working in connection with the Institute refrigerating plant for the last 20 years. These posts require only men with good technical experience. Even if men with the minimum general educational qualification are available they cannot be appointed to these posts unless they hold the Government Technical Examination certificates of proficiency in mechanism. The appointments of mechanics in the Development Department are excluded from the operation of article I of the Public Service Notification. Inasmuch as only men with technical qualification in the line and experience will be appointed to these posts it is recommended that the posts of mechanic and assistant mechanic at the King Institute as well as the mechanic and driver at the Government General Hospital and the driver at the Government Hospital for Women and Children, Madras, may be excluded from the operation of article I of the Public Service Notification.

General Hospital, Madras and Photo-Artist (Pay Rs. 85-4-125)
Government Hospital for Women and Children, Madras.

The appointments of photographers at the above Government Institutions may be excluded from the provisions of article I of the Public Service Notification as they do not require educational qualification, except expert knowledge in that branch for which they have to pass Government Technical Examinations. Only those candidates who have passed the Government Technical Examination in the line and have sufficient experience will in future be appointed to these posts. It is pointed out in this connection that appointments of Photo-Lithographers in the Survey Department are excluded from the provision of Article I of Public Service Notification.

Attendants in the superior grade at the Mental Hospital, Madras - Pay Rs. 80-4-100.

At present these posts are filled either by European or Indians. It has been the practice in the hospital to entertain pensioned or demobilised European or Anglo-Indian soldiers who have no general educational qualification as European attendants. Inasmuch as Ex. Army European or Anglo-Indians with the minimum general educational qualification will not be forthcoming for these appointments, it is recommended that the appointments of attendants in the superior grade at the Mental Hospital if held by Europeans or Anglo-Indians be excluded from the operations of Article I of the Public Service Notification.

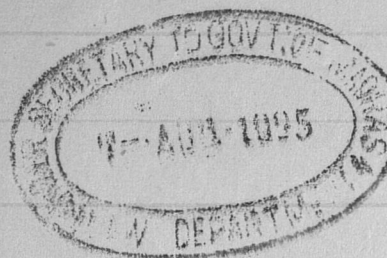

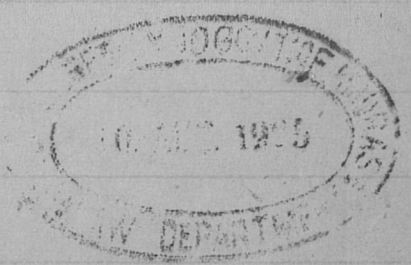
