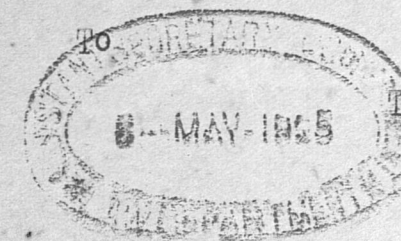

MILITARY - Ex-service - Educational concessions.

The G.Os. issued on the subject from time to time provide for the grant of concessions to the children and brothers and sisters of exmilitary men. None of them provides for any concessions to exmilitary men themselves. I have received an application from an exmilitary man who was in field service before 11-11-1919 for concession to prosecute his studies. He says he volunteered for Field Service while prosecuting his studies in the School Final Class. If brothers or children could get concession there appears to be no reason why he himself should not get it. But as the G.Os. are silent on the point, I request the orders of Government in the matter.

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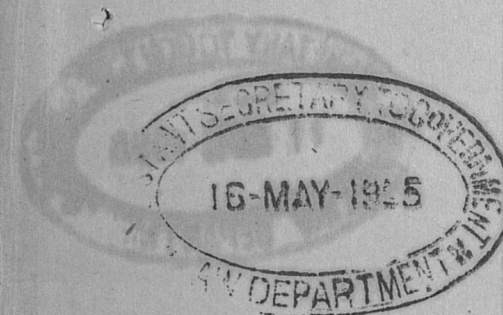

Subject: Ex-army men - Educational concessions.

The genesis of the scheme of the educational concessions in question is the scheme prepared by the Government of India in 1918 - page 2 of G.O. No. 663 Home (Education), dated 23-5-1918. This scheme contemplated the grant of educational facilities to the children of incapacitated or deceased soldiers and the various orders of the Local Government ~~which~~ extended the concessions to other than incapacitated soldiers make mention of only the children of such soldiers and in certain cases their brothers and sisters. ^{also} The absence of any reference to the soldiers themselves ~~would~~ was obviously due to the circumstance that soldiers would generally be too old to join school after discharge. Those discharged from the army and fit to receive a course of education now must be few ~~and far between~~. The few such cases that arise may appropriately be met by the grant of scholarships from the general scholarships at the disposal of the Educational Department. It seems ~~now~~ too late to think of a general order providing for the education ~~of~~ discharged soldiers.

2. So far as the present case is concerned, the Collector gives no idea of the age of the applicant and the school which he desires to join. These particulars may be called for and on receipt ~~of~~ thereof the D.P.I. may be asked ^{if} it will be possible to allot a scholarship to him. Should that be impossible, the Government may consider the question of giving him a special scholarship. A draft memo is submitted.
