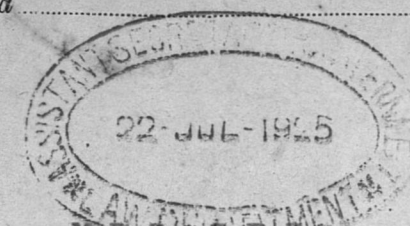

Sir,

I beg to submit the following representation regarding my pay in the Indian Educational Service.

2. I was first appointed to the public service in April 1907 in the Subordinate Educational Service, and was promoted to the Provincial Educational Service in 1912. In 1916, I was specially selected by Sir Henry Stone from among the members of the Provincial Educational Service as the first Principal of the newly Created Ceded Districts College at Anantapur. When the College was raised to the first grade in July 1918, I was continued as Principal of the College on a salary of Rs. 500/ per mensem.

In July 1919, I was appointed, in the exigencies of Public Service, to act as additional Professor of English in the Presidency College in the Indian Educational Service on Rs. 500/. I was reverted in July 1920 to my substantive appointment of Junior Professor of English in the Madras Educational Service, and was again temporarily promoted to the Indian Educational Service in September 1920 after a short interval of about three months. The Junior Professorship in English which was my substantive appointment was subsequently included in the cadre of the Indian Educational Service and I was confirmed in that service with effect from the 23rd February 1921. My initial pay was then fixed at Rs. 500/, and I did not get the benefit either of my year's service as Principal of the Anantapur College on Rs. 500 per mensem or of my acting and temporary service subsequently of nearly 1½ years in the Indian Educational Service, towards increments in that service.

I had therefore to draw the same pay, viz., Rs. 500 from July to September 1921, ie., ~~practically~~ ^{over} for a period of three years.

I was Principal of the Ceded Districts College, Anantapur for years, and if I had not been transferred to the Presidency College in the interests of the Public Service in 1919, I would in all likelihood not only have continued in that appointment, but also been recommended for promotion to the Indian Educational Service substantively with effect from the date on which that post was transferred to the I.E.S., viz 1st September 1920, as I was connected with the former institution from its very inception. I would in that case have drawn a salary of at least Rs.550 from that date, with a duty allowance of Rs. 150, which would have counted towards my leave, salary and pension.

3. Again, owing to the operation of the pause at Rs.600, I drew Rs. 600 during 1922-23 and 1923-24. I have put in 18 years' service and I am now 47 years of age. There is consequently no possibility of my even reaching the maximum salary in the ordinary time-scale. I take it that the pause at Rs. 600 is intended for officers directly recruited to the Indian Educational Service and not for officers who enter the Service after a long term in the Madras Educational Service. Under the note to para 234 (6) on page 104 of the Manual of Appointments and Allowances, local Government are empowered to abolish the pause at Rs. 600/ in cases of officers of Indian domicile promoted to the I.E.S., who are ineligible for over-seas pay. I gather that this discretion is proposed to be exercised by the Madras Government in the case of some of the promoted officers of the service, a few of whom are my juniors and are also of very nearly of my age.

If my surmise is correct, I beg to submit that my claim to the abolition of the pause is equally strong for the following reasons:-

(1). Owing to my intermittent acting and temporary promotions to the Indian Educational Service, I drew a salary of Rs.500 per mensem for three years without an increment.

(2). I did not get the benefit of my acting and temporary appointments of nearly a year and a half when my initial

(3). I am already 47 years of age and there is no possibility of my reaching the maximum of even the ordinary time-scale before I retire.

4. I beg to request that the Government will be pleased to exempt me from the pause at Rs. 600/, and to permit me to draw Rs. 650/ from the 1st September 1923 and Rs. 750/ from the 1st September 1925.

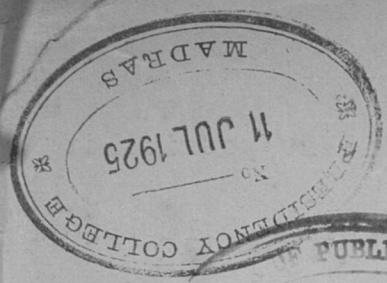

Subject : - M.R.Ry. S.E.Ranganathan Avergal - exemption
from the pause at Rs. 600/-

Mr. Ranganathan reached the stage of Rs. 600 on
1st September 1922. He is now forty seven years of age
and cannot reach the maximum of the scale sanctioned for
officers of the I.E.S. before retirement.

2. Mr. Chakravarthi, who also reached the stage of
Rs. 600 on 1st September 1922 and is now only 42 years
of age, has been exempted by the Govt. from the pause
at Rs. 600. The exemption, however, will not have re-
trospective effect, and Mr. Chakravarthi will be allowed
to draw, from 1st September 1925, pay at Rs. 750 per mensem
instead of at Rs. 700 per mensem.

3. It will be seen from the Director's letter on
page 10 of G.O. 713 L.E., dd. 8-5-24, that Mr. Rangana-
than was held to have better claims than Mr. Chakra-
varthi for exemption from the pause at Rs. 600 per
mensem. It is submitted that, in view of the Director's
recommendation, the concession sanctioned in the case
of Mr. Chakravarthi may be extended to Mr. Rangana-
than also. The file may be sent to Finance for
acceptance of the proposal.

The proposal of the Law department

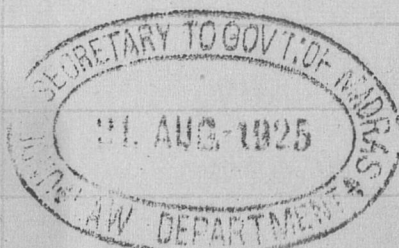
