Sir,

In continuation of my letter R.C. No. 354 B/24 dated the 24th July 1925, reporting the progress of work in -- connection with the scrutiny of the Elementary Education survey Records of the various Taluks in the Presidency, I have the honour to state that the reports on *7 more districts noted below have since been compiled and sent to the Press, and that printed copies of the Reports on the Guntur, Anantapur, Cuddapah, Kurnool and the Nilgris districts have been submitted to Government up till now. Survey maps and registers are still due from the **7 Taluks mentioned below. The Educational survey officers concerned

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concerned have been asked to suspend all other work and to submit the records due from them by the 20th August. It is expected that the records will be received by the prescribed date and the district reports will be completed by the end of August, as stated in paragraph 4 of my letter R.C. No. 354 B/24 dated the 24th July 1925.

2. The reports of all the districts will not, however, have been printed by the end of the current month, and the proof of several district reports will have to be corrected only in September 1925. It is proposed thereafter to compile a consolidated Report on the Elementary Education survey of the Presidency as stated in paragraph 4 of my letter quoted above, on the lines indicated in the draft table of contents submitted herewith. The work of completing the district reports and of compiling the Presidency Report will take a full month from 1-9-'25. The services of the assistant and clerk sanctioned in G.O. No. 1032 Law (Education), dated the 19th June 1925 are required to assist the Special Officer in compiling the Report and preparing the Annexures thereto from the district reports. In these circumstances I request that you will be so good as to obtain sanction of Government to the continuance till 30-9-'25 of the Special Officer and the temporary establishment sanctioned in the G.O. mentioned above.

3. I shall submit a reappropriation statement to meet the extra cost involved by these proposals on receipt of the orders of Government on this letter.
