Budget Estimate - 1925-26 - Part II schemes - Opening of a secondary training class attached to the aided secondary school, Srirangam.

Proposals of the Director of Public Instruction

The Retrenchment Committee recommended as a measure of economy that training classes might be attached to schools which provide for general education and that subsidies might be paid to meet the cost of maintenance of such classes instead of opening separate training schools under Government management. Agreeably to the suggestion, the Director circularised all District Secondary Education Boards, District Educational Councils and Inspecting officers of the Department inviting proposals for attaching training classes to schools under private management. In response to this circular, the Director received eight schemes. He has rejected all except one, mainly on the ground that facilities for training in the districts concerned are fairly sufficient or that the percentage of trained teachers in them is not below the presidency average.

2. The Director recommends for adoption one scheme, namely, that of attaching a secondary training class to the aided secondary school, Srirangam. It is stated that the management is prepared to undertake the maintenance of the class if a grant is made for the purpose. The opening of the class has been recommended by the District Secondary Education Board, the District Educational Council and the District Educational Officer, Trichinopoly. There is at present no secondary training class in this district. The Director therefore proposes that a class may be opened with the object of training 20 secondary grade teachers every year and that permission may be accorded to open the class with effect from July 1925 for a period of two years in the first instance.

Notd by the Law (Education) Department

The arrangement proposed by the Director is an economical method of providing facilities for training. Leaving aside the expenditure under contingencies and stipends which will have to be incurred on the same scale whether the work of training is undertaken by the Department or left to be provided for by a private management, there will be appreciable saving under 'establishment charges' if the training be entrusted to a private body. The normal scale of establishment for a secondary training class attached to one of the Government institutions would be:-

The amount proposed to be given to the management as grant in aid on this account in this case is Rs 1,900. In other words the expenditure to Government is reduced to the extent of Rs 4,406. It is therefore recommended that the Director's proposal may be approved and a provision of Rs 4,800 included in the next year's budget.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

[SUBJECT.—*Supplementary demand of Rs. 22,769 under Grant XVII. Education—Transferred.*]

*The Government Victoria College, Palghat—Rs. 6,300.*—Agreeably to an undertaking given to the Legislative Council, the Government recently sanctioned the opening of the B.A. classes in this College with effect from 1st July 1925. The additional expenditure involved is Rs. 14,200 for the current year (Rs. 5,500 non-recurring and Rs. 8,700 recurring). There are recurring savings amounting to Rs. 3,500 due to the abolition of the middle school department of the College. The net additional amount to be provided for is Rs. 10,700. An expenditure of Rs. 4,400 has been authorized by His Excellency the Governor under section 72-D (2) (b) of the Government of India Act. The balance of the amount required for the current year is Rs. 6,300.

2. *Employment in the Ceded Districts College, Anantapur, of an Assistant Lecturer in Physics in the Subordinate Educational Service in the place of a temporary tutor—Rs. 250.*—In 1920, when provision was made in the Ceded Districts College for instruction in Group I (Mathematics) of the B.A. Pass course, sanction was accorded to the employment of a tutor in Physics on a pay of Rs. 93½ a month. Since then, the College has been affiliated to the University in Group II (Natural Science, Physics and Chemistry) of the Intermediate course. This together with the normal increase in the number of students taking Physics as part of their course for Group I of the Intermediate and the B.A. has increased the quantity of work to be done in the Physics department of the College. The tutor has to do the same kind of work as an assistant lecturer. It is therefore proposed to include the tutor's post in the cadre of the Subordinate Educational Service—Collegiate branch (pay Rs. 125—5—175—7½—250).

3. *Institution of a project course in the Engineering College, Guindy—Rs. 3,200.*—The Conference on Engineering Education held at Simla in 1921 recommended the inclusion of a project course in the curriculum of the Engineer class in the College of Engineering, Guindy. The object aimed at is to train Civil Engineer students in surveying projects relating to water-supply, construction of railway lines, etc., so that they may be able to prepare schemes which a senior officer can examine, criticise, pass orders on and hand over for execution. The Government have accepted the recommendation and they propose to introduce the scheme with effect from the current year. Provision is to be made for the training of 30 students annually involving a recurring expenditure of Rs. 3,200. The expenditure represents batta charges to students while in the survey camp, the pay of lascars who have to help students in surveying and sundry charges such as cartage of materials and tents, purchase of pegs, flags, etc.

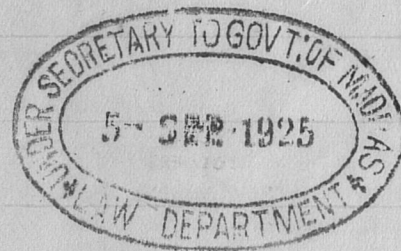
4. *Opening of a secondary training class in the Government Higher Elementary Training School, Chicacole—Rs. 3,600.*—There are no facilities at present for the training of secondary grade teachers in the Ganjam and Vizagapatam districts. Untrained teachers in these districts have to go to Rajahmundry for the necessary training. It is proposed to open a secondary training class at Chicacole for training 20 Oriya and Telugu teachers in alternate years. The expenditure provided for represents the cost of employing an additional graduate teacher and a drawing master, the charges on account of stipends to teachers under training and allotment for contingencies.

5. *Admission of an additional batch of students for higher elementary training in the Government Training School, Chicacole—Rs. 4,610.*—Out of a total of 1,186 Telugu teachers in the elementary schools in the Ganjam district, only 482 are

trained. The number of Telugu elementary schools having standards above the fifth which have to be staffed by higher elementary grade teachers is 143. The proposal is to train an additional batch of 40 Telugu teachers of the higher elementary grade in alternate years. The expenditure represents the pay of a graduate teacher, the charges on account of stipends to teachers undergoing training and allotment for contingencies.

6. Opening of a secondary training class attached to the Aided Secondary School, Srirangam—Rs. 4,800.—The Retrenchment Committee recommended as a measure of economy that training classes should be attached to schools which provide for general education and that subsidies should be paid to them to meet the cost of maintenance of such classes. The management of the High School at Srirangam has agreed to undertake the training of 20 secondary grade teachers every year. The expenditure represents the subsidy that has to be paid to the management. The arrangement proposed is an economical method of providing facilities for training.
