SUBJECT:—

Inspection of Vernacular Education.

Sir,

I am directed to request that, if there is no objection and with the permission of the Hon'ble Minister in charge, this Government may be supplied with copies of any resolution or orders issued by the Government of Madras ----- on the question of handing over inspection of Vernacular Education to local bodies, and the arrangements made for separate inspection on behalf of Government and also with a list showing the numbers, grades and pay of the inspecting officers for Vernacular Education, if any, who have been retained by the Local Government. I am particularly to ask whether officers formerly in the service of the Madras -----Government have been transferred to the service of local bodies, and, if so, under what conditions the transfer has taken place.

Inspection of vernacular education.

In reply to your letter, No. 354 Q.2
dated 25th August 1925, I am directed to
say that vernacular schools in this Pre-
sidency are classified as elementary
schools. The inspection of this class
of schools is retained in the hands of the
Government. The management of elemen-
tary schools rests either with private
individuals and bodies, ^{the latter} including mission-
~~ary bodies~~ or ~~the~~ public bodies such as
municipal councils and taluk boards. ^{Local bodies do not possess}
~~either case~~ there is no regularly consti-
^{an} tuted inspecting agency, apart from that
~~agency~~ provided by the Govt. The
staff directly in charge of the inspection
of elementary schools consists of 258
officers, on a pay of Rs. 75-5-100-10-150
with a selection grade ~~on~~ Rs. 150-10-250
a month for 25 per cent of the number of
officers. Each officer is expected to
deal with 133 schools on the average.
2. There is no proposal at
present to transfer inspection of elemen-
tary schools to local bodies.
