1. Read resolutions passed at the conference of the Deputy Inspectors of Schools, President District Educational Council, Ganjam, and District Educational Officer, Ganjam, held on 17th and 18th March 1925.

RESOLUTIONS

1. For two teachers the space should be if one room at 12x24 or a minimum of 288 sq.ft.
2. For three teachers 400 sq.ft.
3. No single teacher shall teach more than three standards.
4. For Normal grant 35 percent of strength in standards above standard 1-B. should be fit to pass.
5. The Council's syllabus is the standard but compulsory subjects are as defined in the rules.
6. Stammering is a disqualification for teaching. Bad deafness is also a disqualification.
7. That it be recommended to the Council that words 'or Lower Elementary trained with completed certificated and declared competent by the Deputy Inspector of Schools be added to Resolution No. 35 dated 6-12-1924.
8. To recommend to the Council that teachers should not be allowed to teach in more than one recognised school. This



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This excludes teachers from teaching in both day and night schools unless the Day school is a half time school.

9. That minimum strength should be 20 and average attendance 15.

10 Recognition for more than one aided Day school in a ---- village should not be given unless the village makes out a case for it.

11 That half time mid-day schools should be encouraged and that in night schools pupils of 16 and above only be admitted. The assessment ordinarily be in either case at half rates.

12. Deputy Inspectors of schools will naturally see that the work in Night schools is suitable to the age of the pupils.

13. That the managers of aided Elementary schools be required to submit with the aid application a list of their holidays for the year.

RESOLUTION

The above resolutions are recommended to the Government for approval except Nos 1 and 2.

minimum staff. The rules give full discretion to the managements concerned.

No.4. - p1 Supra

The acceptance of this resolution is not recommended. It seems to me to be a too hard and fast rule; the grant should not be determined solely on the results.

No.5. p1 Supra

The resolution is in conformity with the provisions contained in rule 13 of the rules framed under Section 41 (2) and note (4) to clause (b) of the rules framed under Section 3(V) of the Madras Elementary Education Act of 20.

No. 6. p1 Supra

The resolution is unobjectionable. Under rule 3 of the rules framed under Section 41(2) the council can refuse or withdraw recognition of a school, if there is an unfit teacher.

No.7. p1 Supra

This may be accepted.

No.8. p1 Supra

is not recommended for acceptance as under present conditions it is likely to be detrimental to night schools.

No.9. p2 Supra

This may be negatived as I consider that it will be detrimental to the interest of [Mission and labour] schools for backward classes as the average attendance may be and often is below 15.

No.10. is a matter for the council to decide as it is the council in whom the grant of recognition is vested.

No. 11.

I do not object to the first part of the resolution but I do not to the second as this would

would exclude boys of the working classes who have passed the compulsory stage but are below 16.

I have no objection to resolutions Nos.12 and 13 being accepted.

2. That the teachers employed to teach the 5th and 6th standards of the Elementary schools shall have passed at least the 3rd Form examination.
3. That definite bylaws and standing orders of the council be formulated in regard to recognition, Transfer of management and grants.

1. Mover withdraws this on the assurance that this council regards its previous resolution on the matter as not prohibiting the giving of a full grant to deserving night schools.
2. In future recognition be not granted for 5th standard unless it is in the charge of the teacher of Higher Elementary grade trained or untrained. *Here enters from Mr. Pantulu*
