Sir,

I have the honour to invite the attention of Government to the copy of the special report submitted with my letter R.C.No.2242 C/24 dated 13-11-24 showing in detail the work done by Miss. V.L.Fearn, Woman specialist in Physical Instruction, from 6-1-1922 to 30-6-1924 and to state that if her work in the department of physical instruction in Girls schools, both European and Indian in the city of Madras, is to be discharged efficiently, some manner of conveyance is absolutely necessary for her as she has much touring to

to do in Madras going about from school to school. This question was not pressed by Miss Fearn till now as she has been living with her parents in Madras and was using her father's motor car. As her parents are going away from Madras, she will not have a motor car and I am convinced that a conveyance is quite essential for her. I therefore strongly recommend to Government that Miss Fearn be granted a conveyance allowance of Rs.50 per mensem subject to the condition that she maintains a motor car or a trap or a government cart. a condition imposed on the Assistant Inspectress of schools, Madras Girls Range, vide Government Memo No.1966-1 Civil Service Regulations dated 21-6-1924.

2. I also strongly recommend that Government be pleased to reconsider their orders conveyed in G.O. No.742 Law(Education) dated 17-6-1922 and to treat Miss.Fearn as an officer of the III grade and she be allowed to draw 1 3/5 first class fares in respect of her railway journeys only, ~~xxxx~~ similar to the concession granted to Miss.W.Park, Domestic Economy Lecturer, in G.O.No.1016 Mis Law(Education) dated 23-6-1924 as she is a European officer having jurisdiction all over the Presidency and as, from experience she has found it extremely difficult to travel second class.

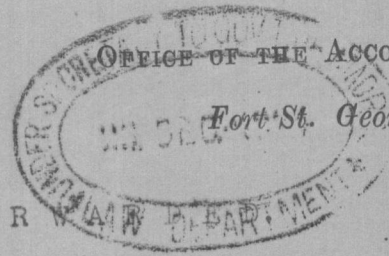

2. There is no audit objection to Government sanctioning a conveyance allowance of Rs.50/- per mensem to Miss. V.E.Fearn subject to the conditions mentioned in the Director of Public Instruction's letter and the necessary provision of funds to meet the extra expenditure.
3. As her pay is Rs.400/- she is under note 2 to Annexure I to the Madras Travelling Allowance Rules entitled to travelling allowance at the rates applicable to officers of Grade IV (i.e., one grade above that to which her pay would entitle her). Sanction of Government in the Finance Department will be necessary if any higher rate is to be sanctioned to her.

The D.P.I.'s proposals are ~~that~~ -

- (i) ~~To grant~~ ^{be granted} a conveyance allowance of Rs 50 per mensem to Miss Fearn and
- (ii) ~~To treat~~ ^{be treated} Miss Fearn as an officer of the third grade to enable her to draw travelling allowance at first class rates for railway journeys only.

2. As regards the first proposal, Miss Fearn's work is not confined to Madras City alone, she tours throughout the whole presidency and cannot claim a conveyance allowance for the period she is away from Madras. Further, in consequence of the recommendations of the Retrenchment Committee, the Inspectress of Girls' Schools, Central Circle, whose jurisdiction extends over Madras and other adjoining districts has been deprived of the conveyance allowance she was in receipt of for some years. There appears therefore to be

^{no} strong case for the grant of a conveyance allowance to Miss Fearn. If the proposal is to be considered, it will be necessary to ascertain the average number of miles which she has to travel daily in the course of her duties within the limits of Madras City. ^{and the period for which she is absent on tour in the presidency}

2. The question of the grant to Miss Fearn of a higher rate of travelling allowance was fully considered in the notes to G.O. No. 742 (Education) dated 17-6-22. ^(answer negative) No fresh grounds have been adduced for a reconsideration of the orders. The case of Miss Park

is special as the grant of first class travelling allowance to her was sanctioned by the Govt. of India as early as 1915. The concession had to be continued to her as a personal matter. Her successor, however, will not be entitled to such special treatment.

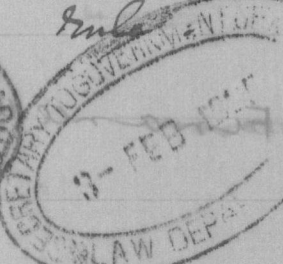
