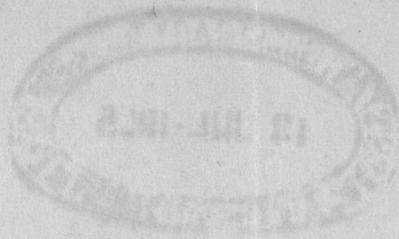

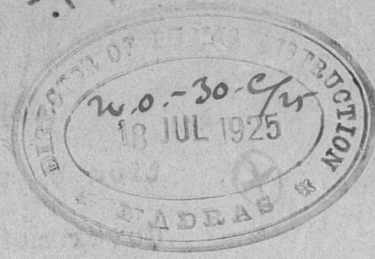

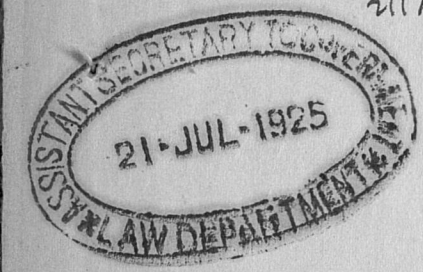
In G.O. No. 82 Public, dated 27th January 1922 heads of ~~the~~ departments were asked to keep in view the desirability of observing the principle that the public officers in language areas should be manned as far as possible by persons belonging to those language areas.

In paragraph 5 of G.O. No. 658 Public, dated 15th August 1922 heads of offices in Telugu districts and Oriya tracts were instructed to keep a record of all persons not belonging ~~in~~ by origin to those districts or tracts and to take steps as far as possible to reduce the proportion whenever opportunities offered themselves.
