Order—No. 1759, Law (Education), dated 12th October 1925.

In G.O. No. 1551, Law (Education), dated 4th September 1925, the draft of a proposed alteration in the rules framed under section 42 (2) of the Madras Elementary Education Act, 1920, was published for general information and criticism. The Government have considered the suggestions received and are pleased to direct that the draft alteration be confirmed. The following notification will be published in the *Fort St. George Gazette* :—

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 56 of the Madras Elementary Education Act, 1920, the Government (Ministry of Education) are pleased to make the following alteration in the rules framed under section 42 (2) of the Act and published at pages 146—178 of Part I-B of the *Fort St. George Gazette*, dated 21st February 1922 :—

Alteration.

For rule 1 in chapter I of the rules framed under section 42 (2) of the Act, substitute the following :—

Scale of grants.—Teaching grants will be calculated at the following rates :—

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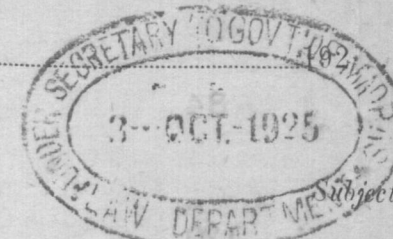
