The Hon'ble Member ^{seems to be} under the impression that the Andhra University is ~~the~~ to serve the needs of one particular town in the Andhra country. Having regard to the fact that the Andhra country comprises 12 districts, that the number of pupils reading in all classes of institutions in the Telugu districts represents approximately 5/12ths of the total number of pupils reading in the Madras Presidency and that about ~~2,000~~ 2,000 students are reading in colleges in the Telugu country besides over 9,000 of them in colleges in the City of Madras, it can by no means be said that in proposing to start a University for the Telugu districts immediately the Government have in any way neglected the interests of other parts of the province. It is perhaps sufficient to draw the Hon'ble Member's attention to the statistics in the report on Public Instruction. The answer may be :-

"The attention of the Hon'ble Member is invited to the subsidiary table No.1(a) appended to volume II of the Report on Public Instruction for 1923-24."
