Sir,

Rule 2 (a) of the Rules relating to the provident fund for teachers in non pensionable service printed in the annexure to G.O.No.1651 Law(Education) dated 29-10-24 lays down that the scheme shall be compulsory on all certificated teachers etc employed in all educational institutions under private management which are recognised under the Madras Educational Rule or under the rules framed under the Madras Elementary Education Act whether aided or unaided, whose pay is not less than Rs.20 per mensem. The scheme therefore seems to be compulsory on the pandits and teachers employed in Sanskrit colleges and schools, which are recognised

recognised under the Madras Educational Rules.

2. In accordance with the above rules the scheme has been already introduced under the orders of Mr. Littlehales, in a few Sanskrit schools and may before long, be introduced into many more. As these schools are under the control and supervision of the Superintendent of Sanskrit Schools, the question arises as to whether he may exercise the powers vested in the District Educational Officers and Inspectresses under para 5 (a) of the ^{Government} General Provident Fund rules, and whether such transactions as admission of subscribers, transfer, withdrawal or closure of accounts, carried out by the Superintendent will have the approval of the Accountant General and the Postal Authorities.

3. In order therefore to avoid difficulties on the points raised above, I have the honour to recommend that the powers vested in the District Educational Officers and Inspectresses under G.O.No.1651 Law (Education) dated 29-10-24 may be extended to the Superintendent of Sanskrit Schools also and that the rule 5 (a) be suitably modified.

4. I request that you will be so good as to obtain the orders of Government on the subject at an early date.

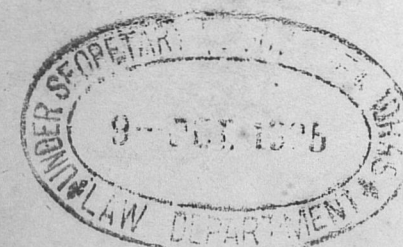
