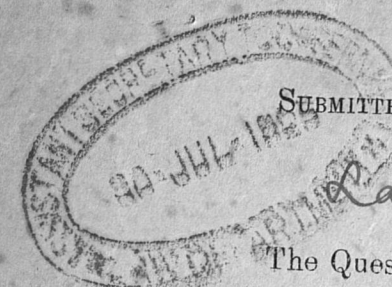

THE LAW (EDUCATION) DEPARTMENT

561. Will the hon.the Minister for Education be pleased to state whether - Government intend to take any steps to better the prospects of secondary - grade trained teachers by enabling them to earn the salary allowed to clerks in Government service possessing the same general educational qualifications?

The question refers to the salary payable to clerks with the grade of a secondary school teacher and to the question whether the Government intend to take any steps to better the prospects of secondary grade trained teachers by enabling them to earn the salary allowed to clerks in Government service possessing the same general educational qualifications?

Copy to Mr. S.

In respect of general educational qualifications, secondary grade teachers may be compared to junior clerks in Government service. The pay of both classes of subordinates is the same (Rs. 35-35-1½-50 -1-60) except that clerks employed in Madras city receive an additional Rs. 5, the junior clerks' scale for Madras city being Rs. 40-40-1½-55-65. Secondary grade teachers employed in the city of Madras are so few ^{in number} that they may be left out of account in instituting a general comparison. As a general proposition, it is correct to say that the starting pay for junior clerks and secondary grade teachers is the same.

2. Mr. Ramachandra Reddi's point seems to be that secondary grade teachers have not the same prospects as clerks, e.g., a secondary-school-leaving certificate holder who is entertained in a public office might pass the necessary tests and gradually rise to the position of a Deputy Tahsildar or Tahsildar in the Revenue Department or ^{might advance to} an executive post in the Excise or the Police Department. The case is different in the Educational Department. ~~An S.S.L.C. holder, if trained, has ordinarily to remain a teacher throughout his service.~~ In the Educational Deptt. higher educational qualification is indispensable while in the other departments it is not educational qualification alone that counts.

3. The following draft answer is suggested:-
"No." The ~~starting~~ ^{starting} pay of Secondary Grade ^{trained} teachers and clerks possessing a completed Secondary School-Leaving Certificate is ^{practically} the same. ~~to prospects, there is no analogy between teachers and clerks.~~

The question refers to the salary payable to clerks with the qualification of a Secondary School Leaving Certificate & not to his prospects.

262 Q.—Mr B. A.—No. The pay of secondary grade trained teachers and clerks possessing a completed Secondary School-Leaving Certificate is practically the same.
