I beg to bring to your kind notice and favourable consideration the following facts:-

2. I was entertained as an Instructor in Electrical Engineering in 1918 and have now completed nearly seven years service. After a little over Two years of service, owing to the very unfortunate illness of the late Mr.Mathews, I was directed to do the duties of the Professor in Electrical Engineering. I have been discharging ~~in~~ these duties for over FOUR and a Half years and have no reason to believe that my service was otherwise than satisfactory.

3. In the ordinary course of events, and under the Civil Service regulations, which were then in force, I should have got in addition to the salary of my substantive appointment Rs.1200/5 or Rs.240 at the least and should now be drawing Rs.370/- plus 240/- or Rs.610/-

4. Under the Fundamental rules, which have subsequently come into force, and which I have accepted to abide by in the usual course, I should have started in the Indian Educational Service, on the scale next higher to the pay I was drawing at the time, i.e., at Rs.400/-; and with the increments that have since fallen due, I should now be getting Rs.400/- plus 200/- or Rs.600/-

5. The posts of Assistant Instructors of Civil Engineering and of Surveying are borne on the Provincial service establishment of the P.W.D. as Assistant Engineers carrying salaries of 250-25-750/ and the post of the Instructor in Mechanical Engineering in the college, of an analogous nature carries a salary of 300-750. The post of Instructor in Electrical Engineering is analogous to either of them, and should normally have carried the same pay. The post

was however sanctioned on Rs.200-40/2-400 /- which was subsequently increased to 250/-40/2-450/-,and I was placed on this scale at a salary below that of my compeers in the college ,doing similar duties; and insted of my getting what was legitimately my due for my officiating service in a superior appointment,I was only given an allowance of 1/10 of the salary which Mr.Mathews was drawing at the time of handing over,presumably ,treating the work as doing the current duties of the office,while all the time I have been carrying on all the duties of the post.

7. Even if the appointment is treated as on the Madras Educational Service, and started on the pay <sup>(which pay?)</sup> I was then drawing, I should by now have been drawing a salary of Rs.500/- against Rs.490/- I now draw.

Subject: Memorial of M.R.Ry. P. Subba Rao Pantulu, Ag. Professor of Electrical Engineering, College of Engineering, Guindy.

Mr. Mathews (late), Professor of Higher Electrical Engineering, College of Engineering, Guindy, proceeded on leave from 14-2-21 and Mr. Subba Rao, the Laboratory Assistant was appointed to do the duties of the Professor in addition to his own - Vide G.O. No. 275 Law (Edn) dated 10-3-22) The Government sanctioned the grant to him of a special pay of Rs 120 per mensem, in addition to his pay as Laboratory Assistant, Viz. Rs 250-40/2 - 450.

2. In September 1922, Mr. Subba Rao requested that his status should be raised by the inclusion of his permanent post in the M. E. S. The Government directed that the designation of his permanent appointment be altered into "Instructor in Electrical Engineering". They, however, declined to raise his pay till he reached the maximum in his time-scale of pay, or to include his post in the M.E.S.

3. In August 1923, on a further representation made by him, he was designated as 'Ag. Professor of Electrical Engineering'. He was ~~informed~~ informed that the new designation would not give him any claim for extra remuneration or for permanent appointment to the post, in case it became vacant.

4. Mr. Subba Rao requests that, as the post of Professor of Higher Electrical Engineering in the I.E.S. is now permanently vacant, he may be confirmed in that post, or, in the alternative, that

Since the post of Professor of Higher Electrical Engineering in the I.E.S. is now permanently vacant, he may be confirmed in that post, or, in the alternative, that

he may be appointed to the M.E.S. on a salary of Rs 500, the scale next above his present salary.

5. The Lee Commission have recommended the provincialisation of the I.E.S., and no appointments to that cadre are now made. Mr. Subba Rao's request for confirmation in the I.E.S. is <sup>(in)</sup>admissible.

6. On the 14th February 1921, Mr. Subba Rao was in receipt of a pay of (Rs 240 plus 40) = Rs 280 per mensem in his permanent appointment. If, on that date, a post in the M.E.S. had been created in place of a post in the I.E.S., Mr. Subba Rao would have been allowed only a pay of Rs 300 per mensem, and he would now be drawing ~~only~~ Rs 400 per mensem as a member of the M.E.S. By the orders issued in G.O. No. 275 Law (Edn) dated 10-3-22, Mr. Subba Rao distinctly benefitted in that, ~~this~~ his total emoluments on 14-2-21 were fixed at Rs 240 plus Rs 40 plus 120 = Rs 400 per mensem. He is now in receipt of a pay of Rs 370 plus 120 = or Rs 490 per mensem. In view of the special rate of pay allowed to him in the past, there appears to be no ground for ~~acceding~~ to his request for inclusion in the M.E.S. on an initial salary of Rs 500 per mensem.

7. The question of permanently filling the post of Prof. of Higher Electrical Engineering has been deferred till the receipt of orders on the recommendations of the Lee Commission. The D.P.I. is ~~of~~ of the opinion that the status and pay of Mr. Subba Rao will have to be determined only after the receipt of those orders.

8. For orders whether the memorialist may be informed that, in view of the impending reorganisation of the higher educational services, the Government are unable to accede to his request.

With reference to the Hon'ble the Minister's note on page 2 ante, it is submitted that the post of Professor of Higher Electrical Engineering in the College of Engineering, Guindy, is included in the I.E.S. cadre. Under existing orders, the sanction of the Secretary of State is necessary ~~to~~ the abolition of the post in the I.E.S. and the creation in its place of a permanent post in the M.E.S. If, as recommended by the Lee Commission, the I.E.S. is provincialised, it ~~may~~ be open to the Local Government to sanction such an arrangement without the sanction of the higher authorities. The question of confirmation of Mr. Subba Rao as Professor of Higher Electrical Engineering in the M.E.S. will have <sup>to</sup> lie over till then.

2. The post of Instructor in Electrical Engineering permanently held by Mr. Subba Rao is now outside the regular cadres. It is, however, open to the Local Government to sanction <sup>its</sup> inclusion in the M.E.S. cadre and to grant to Mr. Subba Rao such initial pay in the M.E.S. as they may consider suitable. This question was discussed in the notes to G.O. No. 510 (Mis) <sup>(Law/Education)</sup> dated 6-4-23. The consent of Finance is necessary to the ~~same~~ proposal.

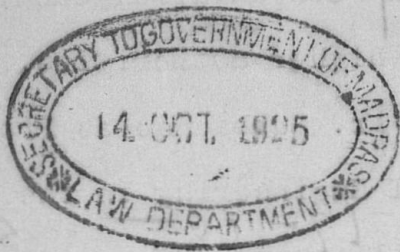
