The Commissioner requests that Government will be pleased to exempt Mr.V. Narasimha Ayya, clerk in the Excise Commissioner's office, from the provisions of Article 1 of the Public Services Notification with a view to his being appointed as an Upper Division clerk in the scale of Rs.65-4-125.

2. Mr. Narasimha Ayya entered service in 1908 and has put in 17 year's service. He has passed Typewriting (Advanced) and Shorthand (Intermediate) and his work as a typist in this

office

office has been extremely satisfactory. As the Commissioner's camp clerk since 1-4-1924 he has been doing preliminary inspection work in the circle and taluk offices which is usually done by an Upper Division clerk - and attending to the correspondence arising in camp to the Commissioner's satisfaction. He is above the average and intelligent. His long experience in the office will enable him to do any work now done by an upper division clerk without difficulty.

3. At present he is drawing pay at Rs.65/- in the scale of Rs.40-80. The Commissioner requests that he may be given exemption in order to enable him to be promoted to the scale of Rs.65-125 which he fully deserves.

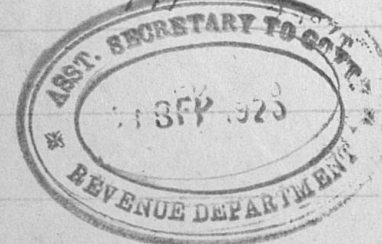

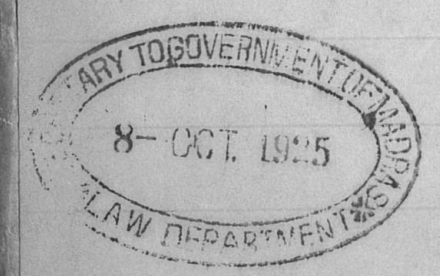
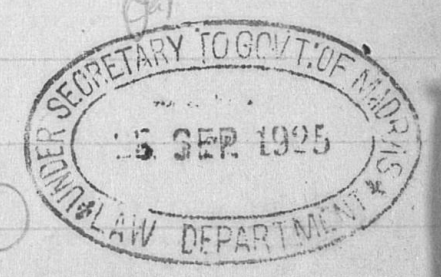
