I have the honour to bring to your kind notice that a sum of Rs.4165/- is to be met from provincial funds for 1924-25 to the elementary education funds. If the sum of Rs.799 is taken credit as per para 2 of G.O.No.989 Misc., dated 17th June 1924 a sum of Rs.3366 is due from provincial funds. Out of this, a sum of Rs.2509 (1854 with reference to G.O.No.1121 dated 10th July 1924 and Rs.655 with reference to G.O.No.872 Law (Education) dated 29th May 1924) has already been received. A sum of Rs.857 is yet to be paid from provincial funds. In G.O.No.165

Approved by the G.O. for 24-25

dated 5th February 1925 the Government sanctioned only Rs.185/- for the last quarter and Rs.432 has been deducted as savings in column 6 of the G. O.

The Government in their G.O.No. 2326 Misc., L & M., dated the 22nd August 1924 (copy attached) sanctioned for the utilisation of the amount (sanctioned for the maintenance of the abolished 3 mohammadan schools) on other elementary schools.

I therefore request that the Government will be pleased to pass orders for the payment of the balance sum of Rs.672/- before the close of the official year.

ORDER:-

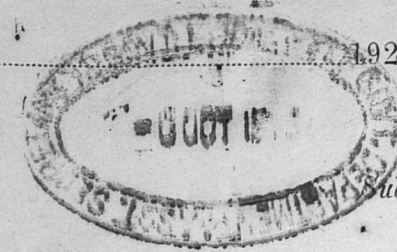

I have the honour to submit herewith the letter R.O.C.No.4.G.O/25 dated 20-2-25 from the Chairman, Municipal Council, Vaniambadi, with the following remarks.

2. The Chairman requests the payment of a subsidy of Rs.672 taking into account the usual recurring subsidy paid to the Council in 1923-24 and for which credit was allowed to be taken in the Budget Estimate for 1924-25 of the Elementary Education Fund under the Council's control. From 1924-25, Government decided to pay the actual ~~xxxxxx~~ recurring expenditure incurred from provincial funds in 1920-21 on the maintenance of Elementary Schools under the proviso to Section 37 of the Madras Elementary Education Act to all local authorities that have constituted an

Elementary Education Fund irrespective of the fact whether they levy the Education cess or not. Accordingly, the subsidy payable to the Municipal Council was fixed at Rs.2,466 in G.O. No.1121 Law (Education) dated 10-7-24 as that was the actual expenditure reported to have been incurred from provincial funds in 1920-21 and this amount was paid to the Council in G.Os. Nos. 1121 Law (Education) dated 10-7-24 and 165 Law (Education) dated 5-2-25 after deducting the sum of Rs.432 as per G.O. No.2326 L&M dated 22-8-24. In addition to this, a sum of Rs.655 was also paid in 1924-25 towards the continuance of the payment of the temporary allowance of Rs.4. In these circumstances no balance is still due to the Council.

3. But as there is a difference in the amount of actual recurring expenditure previously reported viz., Rs.2,466 and the amount now reported, the question of the payment of the difference has to be considered. The Chairman reports that the sum of Rs.2,466 reported before is incorrect and that the actual expenditure incurred from provincial funds in 1920-21 on the maintenance of Elementary Schools is Rs.2,895-11-7 or Rs.2,896/- exclusive of the Capitation allowance. The Examiner of Local Fund Accounts who was consulted in the matter also reports that according to the audited figures, the actual recurring expenditure incurred in 1920-21 is Rs.2,895-11-7 or Rs.2,896 exclusive of the expenditure of Rs.534-11-0 or Rs.535 incurred on the payment of capitation allowance (vide) copy of his letter enclosed. The Examiner supports the Chairman's statement and the revised figure now reported has to be accepted. It is stated that the capitation allowance for 1919-20 payable in 1920-21 was not paid in that year on account of financial difficulties but was subsequently paid in 1921-22. The Council has also enhanced the pay of teachers in lieu of the Capitation allowance. In these circumstances the expenditure on account of the capitation allowance which should have been incurred in 1920-21 but which was subsequently paid has also to be taken into account in fixing the actual recurring expenditure incurred in 1920-21.

in 1920-21. The amount of actual recurring expenditure from provincial funds in 1920-21 would then be Rs.3,430 (2,895-11-7 plus 534-11-0) instead of Rs.2,466. Subsidies of Rs.958 and Rs.964 are due to the Council as arrears for the years 1924-25 and 1925-26 respectively as detailed in the margin. The total amount due is Rs.1,922 and I recommend that this may be paid to the Council.

The figures represent the actual recurring expenditure in 1920-21 (excluding the temporary allowance of Rs.4) on the several Elementary Schools which it was stated, were being maintained out of the Provincial subsidy. They do not however include the capitation allowance of Rs.534-11-0 payable in 1920-21 but not paid during the year.
