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Copy of letter ~~xxxxxx~~, dated 29-9-25 from R.Madhava Rao, "Sudarsan" No.10-A, Edward Elliot's Road, Mylapore Post, Madras. to the D.P.I., Madras, thro' the Principal, Presidency College, Madras.

I was a former student of the Madras Presidency College, from which I took my B.A. Degree in Physics in the year 1914. Though I was very interested in some of the applied aspects of Physics, I had to discontinue my higher study of the subject owing to ill health and other unavoidable family circumstances. Last year, however, I again joined the Madras Presidency College as an advanced student. I worked on the subject of Optical Technology under the direction and guidance of the Additional Professor of Physics. After one year of advanced practical training in the subject I had hoped to take up research at the Presidency College in this interesting and useful branch of Physics. The Additional Professor having been satisfied with my work and progress last year, was kind enough to recommend me for an University Studentship this year. Now I understand that the few available studentships this year were awarded to applicants for work in other subjects such as Natural Science and etcetera, as a result of there already being research scholars of the University in Physics. Thus I have been denied the opportunity to work this year as a research scholar of the University in Physics. I am very interested in the subject and very anxious to continue the work I have already commenced, especially when there are such good facilities now for quite a lot of work in the desired direction at the Physical Laboratories attached to the Madras Presidency College. I therefore request that I may be kindly permitted to work as a research student at the Madras Presidency College.

Throughout last year while I was learning work as an advanced student, I was paying a monthly fee of Rupees Twenty. The Additional Professor under whose direction I will have to continue my work has prescribed for me this year the subject of the determination of the limits of tolerances attainable and necessary in the construction of scientific instruments. It is a practical line of work requiring a great deal of patient labour, that will indirectly result in a number of new instruments being made for the laboratory. Under the circumstances when I am receiving no
