Sir.

I have the honour to state that D.Jabamoni, permanent 5th Assistant, Government Girls' School, Karunthattangudi, which was handed over to the management of the Municipal Council, Tanjore, in G.O.No.1132 Law (Education) dated 23-9-22 was transferred by the Inspectress of Girls' Schools, Southern Circle, on 21-12-1922 as acting 1st Assistant on Rs. 30 plus 10 Government Girls' School, Kumbakonam, which was also transferred to the management of the Municipal Council, Kumbakonam, in G.O.No.780 Mis., Law (Education) dated 13-5-1924. The teacher joined duty in her officiating appointment on 4-1-1923. She applied for leave on medical

on medical certificate for two months from 7-1-1924 and again applied for maternity leave for 3 months in continuation thereof. After availing herself of the maternity leave for two months, the teacher re-joined her officiating appointment in the Municipal Girls' School, Kumbakonam, on 7-5-1924 (i.e.) prior to the date on which the Girls' School at Kumbakonam was transferred to the management of the Municipal Council. The Accountant-General who was consulted in the matter states that the leave salary of the teacher is payable from provincial funds (Please see copy of the Accountant-General's letter enclosed).

2. Under subsidiary rule 2 to Fundamental Rule 101(a), leave of any other kind can be granted in continuation of maternity leave if the request for its grant is supported by a medical certificate. As there is no provision in the rules to govern a case of the reverse order, the Accountant-General suggests that Government may be addressed for making provision to regulate the combination of the leave under reference. The teacher is reported to be eligible for 4 months' leave on full average salary as she has produced the medical certificate. I recommend that the teacher may be granted the combined leave for 4 months on full average pay.

3. Under the amended note to Fundamental Rule 87, the teacher while on leave will get leave salary calculated on her permanent pay (viz) Rs.22½ per mensem. As the teacher is now employed in the Municipal Girls' School, Kumbakonam, a subsidy of Rs.90/- is payable to the Municipal Council, Kumbakonam, on account of the leave salary of the teacher for the 4 months from 7-1-1924 to 7-5-1924. The expenditure can be met from the anticipated savings in the provision of Rs.14.41 lakhs made in the Civil Budget Estimate for 1925-26 under "31.C(c)-Education-Primary-Grants to local bodies for Primary Education-Voted-Grants-in-Aid-Recurring-teaching".
