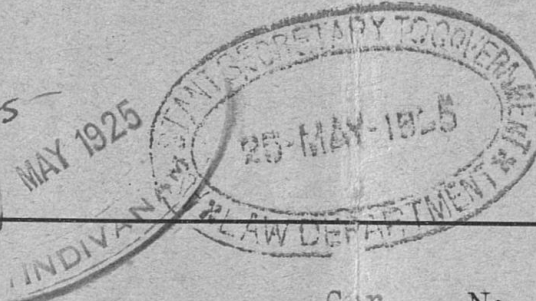
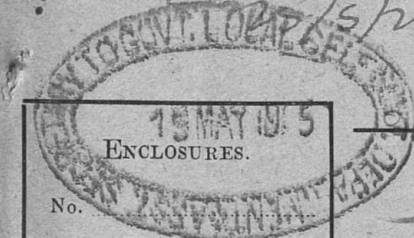

Sir,

With reference to the proceedings of the Director of Public Instruction Madras R.O.C. No.1682 B--24--dated 5-3-1925, regarding the opening of new Board schools with Government subsidy in July next, I have the honour to bring to your kind notice the following few lines for favour of kind consideration and favourable orders.

2. Even in the apportionment of schools made to

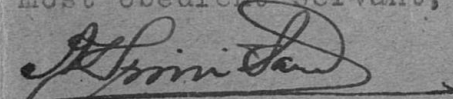
the several Taluk Boards of this district, last year as per G.O. No. 1598 dated 15-10-1924 this Taluk Board was hit hard. Only 30 schools were sanctioned for this Taluk Board which comprises of three taluks, Viz., Tindivanam, Villupuram and Gingee and four ranges of Deputy Inspectors of schools, -- Viz., Tindivanam, Villupuram, Gingee and Vanur, while the same number of schools was found sanctioned to other Taluk Boards with a single taluk and with less number of Deputy Inspectors. There is a deep ^{dis-}content among the members of this Taluk Board and they are very eager that more schools should be opened at least this year. A copy of the Taluk Board resolution No. 87 dated 26-3-1925 on this subject is ~~ex~~ enclosed for favour of kind perusal.

3. I had an informal conference of the Deputy Inspectors of schools of the four ranges in this Taluk Board and they are unanimously of the opinion that to satisfy the present needs at least 60 schools should be opened with -- Government subsidy from July next. They have given me a list of 60 ~~centres~~ centres of population as per details noted in the margin which they have selected out of a large number of school-less villages.

4. More-over this Taluk Board area which is very wide and extensive has a very large population which is educationally very backward. The opening of more schools this year is very urgent.

5. In the above circumstances, and in the interest of elementary education, I request you to be so good as to sanction government subsidy for the opening of at least 60 schools this year.

In continuation of the Director's Proceedings R.C.No. 1682 B--24 dated 13th September 1924, the District Educational Officers are requested to be good enough to submit, in respect of areas under the jurisdiction of Taluk Boards which levy the Education cess a list of centres where new schools are required to serve one or more centres with a total population of over 500. The centres or groups of centres with a ~~total~~ population of 1000 and over should be taken up first and after them those with a population of over 500. The total number of schools proposed to be opened in any one taluk board area should be limited to thirty.

2. The proposals should be based on the results of the Elementary Education Survey. The figures furnished already with reference to the Director's Proceedings quoted above should be revised if necessary.

3. The particulars should be furnished in the Form annexed to these proceedings for each Taluk Board separately, a copy of the list being sent at the same time to the Presidents of Taluk Boards concerned for communicating to this office direct their views and suggestions in respect of the list.

4. Government propose to sanction the opening of the new schools from 1st July 1925. Steps may therefore be taken to secure suitable accommodation and the required number of teachers in consultation with the local bodies.

5. The District Educational Officers are requested to pay their personal attention to this matter and to prepare the statements from the survey records available in their offices. The statements should be submitted so as to reach this office on or before 1st April 1925.

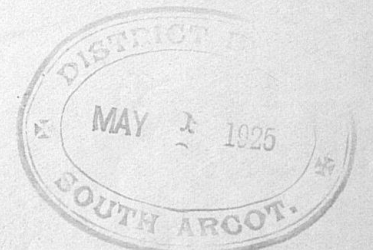

2. From the report on the Elementary Education Survey of the District, it is observed that there are 63 school-less centres with a population of 500 and above in the area under the jurisdiction of the Taluk Board. All the centres referred to in the President's list with the exception of 10 centres find a place in the list of school-less centres annexed to the report. The remaining centres have got adequate educational facilities.

3. Regarding the inadequate number of schools sanctioned in G.O.No.1598 Law (Education) dated 16-10-24, [reference is invited to my letter R.C.No.248-B/24 dated 21-7-24 and the statement annexed to it and it will be observed therefrom that] the maximum number of schools recommended to be opened for each Taluk Board was fixed at 30 and this number was sanctioned for the Taluk Board, Tindivanam. The Taluk Board has therefore no cause for any discontent.

4. With regard to the opening of 60 new schools, I submit that the opening of 30 schools in 1925-26 has been sanctioned in G.Os.No. 877 Law (Education) dated 23-5-1925 and No.1550 Law (Education) dated 4-9-25 and the District Educational Officer has been requested to take steps for the opening of these new schools in school-less centres. There still remain 33 centres according to the Elementary Education survey reported to be provided with schools. The opening of schools in these centres may be considered next year if funds are sanctioned for the purpose. It may be stated in this connection that the Taluk Board is levying the Education cess at $12\frac{1}{2}$ % only on land cess. The Taluk Board may also be advised to open schools in school-less centres with the proceeds of the cess instead of looking into Government for a subsidy.
