In forwarding the accompanying plans of the Madras Government Museum and Connemara Public Library located in the Museum Buildings, I must point out that the buildings are in many ways most unsuitable for the purpose for which they have to be used. Should the Burma Government think of adopting any portions I shall be glad to point out to them the defects that experience has revealed in the buildings if they will communicate with me. They could then make necessary

necessary modifications before construction. The cost of the buildings as per Register of the Buildings is as follows:-
