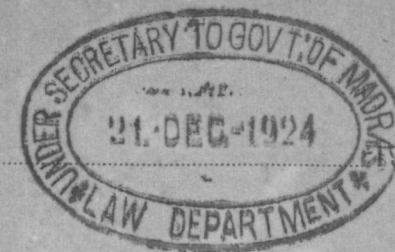

In resubmitting herewith the letter R.O.C.No. 472/24 dated 19-12-24 from the President, District Educational Council, Coimbatore referred to me for remarks in Government Endorsement No.4645 A-1 dated 23-12-24, I have the honour to state that the District Educational Council's resolution refers only to elementary schools under public management. Prior to 1906 teachers in schools under local boards also received grants under the Grant-in-Aid Code, in addition to salaries, but the salaries of these teachers were then very low. Since 1906-1907, these board school teachers

teachers have been in receipt of capitation allowance, based on average attendance of pupils, the allowance being subject to reduction for bad work. The position was reviewed in 1918-19, and in para 4 of G.O.No.112 Home(Education) dated 25-1-19, it was decided to abolish capitation allowance and to increase the salaries of teachers. This decision has been carried out by local bodies in general.

2. The results grant system as such disappeared in 1906, so far as board and municipal schools were concerned, though some ^{vestiges} ~~vestiges~~ of it remained in the payment of capitation allowance which was subject to reduction for unsatisfactory work, till April 1923 when this allowance was abolished. Now, the salaries of the teachers in these schools have improved and the schools are as a whole staffed with a better class of teachers. If despite these improvements, the teachers are not working efficiently the authorities concerned can take disciplinary action against the delinquents-instead of introducing a new inducement to ensure satisfactory work.

3. The District Educational Council does not say whence the additional funds required for the purpose are to be obtained. Whatever money Government can spare is now required for further expansion of Elementary Education. Moreover, if we are going to provide extra inducements to teachers even after improving their salaries, there will be no end to such inducements.

4. In this connection, I may also invite the attention of Government to the remarks contained on page 10 of the Bureau of Educations, Occasional report
