Sir,

I beg to apply for a post in the Higher Education Service, (formerly called the Indian Education Service), of your Province, either in the Teaching or in the Administrative line.

I have been educated at the G.S. High School, Jalgaon, and the Deccan College, Poona, in India. I took my B.A. Degree of the Bombay University, from the Deccan College, Poona, with Second Class Honours in History and Economics, in the year 1922.

I joined Brasenose College, at the University of Oxford, in 1923 and have taken all the Examinations, except the final, required for the Honours Degree in Modern History. I shall be taking the final in June 1926, with a period of Indian History as my special subject for the Degree, here. I joined, further, the Secondary Teachers' Training Department, at the University of Oxford, and passed the Examination for the Diploma in Education, both in Theory and Practice in December 1924. I have taught here, in the Central Boys' School, Oxford, and also in the London County Council Secondary School, Brockley, S.E. I am enclosing herewith copies of the testimonials, among others, from the Head Masters of those schools, who personally watched me teaching.

I am enclosing herewith copies of the testimonials only from my tutors and Principal; and can produce more after my Degree, at this University.

My age is twenty-four and am a Marāthā by Caste. I have already spent about three years in this country and am keenly interested in games.

I am prepared to lecture in an Arts College on Indian, Ancient, European and English - Economic, Social, Political and Constitutional with Original Documents - History; General Economics; Indian Economics; Indian Administration; English Constitutional Law; Political Science etc.

Further I am prepared to lecture in a Training College for Secondary School Teachers, on the Teaching of History and Geography; on the Theory - including Psychology - History and Practice of the Western Education.

I am anxious to introduce the Oxford Tutorial System in Indian Colleges, in addition to Lecturing, as far as it is possible, if I shall get a job in the Teaching line. As regards schools, I should try to introduce a modified Public School system, wherever it is possible.

Having studied the Comparative Educational Systems of both the countries - India and England - I would much prefer an administrative post in the Inspectorial line. If time and expenses allow me, I have an idea of inspecting other Elementary, Secondary and Public Schools of this Country and Schools in France and Germany.

I shall be much obliged, if you would kindly give this a favourable consideration at any time this year; or if there is no suitable vacancy this year, I should be very much obliged if you could kindly consider this provisional application which can be supplemented by other testimonials, as required, for a suitable vacancy, next year.
