Sir,

I have the honour to state that it has been decided by the Secretary of State that the pay of an officer whose agreement recites that he has been engaged by the Secretary of State for India in Council should be treated as non-voted.

2. It has further been decided that the agreements of all officers permanently appointed to the Indian Education, Indian Agriculture and Indian Veterinary Services contain this clause and therefore the pays of all such officers should in future be treated as non-voted.

3. It is intended that all similar appointments

to

to the Indian Forest Service and the Indian Service of Engineers should be by the Secretary of State in Council and that the pay of all these officers should in future be treated as non-voted. If the agreement of any present officer of these two services does not recite that he has been appointed by the Secretary of State in Council thus making his pay non-voted, it is the intention of the Secretary of State to reappoint him and from the date of such reappointment his pay should also be treated as non-voted.

4. It is possible that the agreements executed by certain officers in the Indian Police whose pay is at present treated as voted contain recitations that they have been appointed by the Secretary of State for India in Council. These should be examined and if necessary their pays should in future be shown as non-voted.

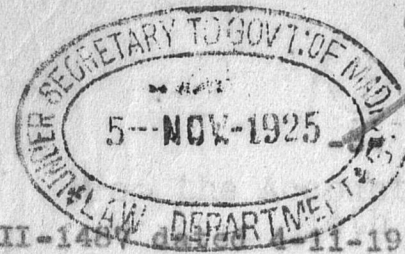
5. In all these cases it is only the permanent appointment to the service which is done by the Secretary of State in Council. Officiating arrangements are in the hands of authorities in India and the pay of such officiating officers should continue to be shown as voted.

6. Any consequent changes may be incorporated in the budget figures for 1926-27.

As the appointment of Mr. Arthur Davies to the post of Principal, Law College, was specially sanctioned by the Secretary of State in Council - vide Government of India, Finance, No. 1220 E.A. dated the 7th June 1921 communicating Secretary of State's despatch No. 76 Public dated the 14th April 1921, his pay will have to be treated as non-voted. This change may be incorporated in the Budget Estimates for 1926-27.

From the Accountant General No. G.III-1486 dated 4th November 1925.

Subject:- Pay of Mr. A. Davies, Principal, Law College, to be treated as 'non-voted'.

Mr. A. Davies was appointed Principal, Law College by the Local Government in December 1913 and his pay has hitherto been treated as 'voted'. The Accountant General states that the appointment of Mr. Davies to the post of Principal, Law College was specially sanctioned by the Secretary of State in Council in his Despatch No. 76, dated 14-4-21 and that his pay should therefore be treated as 'non-voted'. In his Despatch referred to above, the Secretary of State sanctioned a revised scale of pay for the post of Principal, Law College and also fixed the initial pay to be granted to Mr. Davies in the revised scale. These orders cannot be construed in the sense that Mr. Davies owes his appointment to the Secretary of State in Council. In fact, his case has hitherto been held to fall under para 4 of the Govt. of India's letter No. 542, dated 14.6.22 printed in G.O. No. 542 Public, dated 3.7.22 and his pay has been treated as 'voted'. The Accountant General has not hitherto taken objection to this procedure.

It may, however, be mentioned in this connection that a recommendation has been made to the Govt. of India for the inclusion of Mr. A. Davies in the schedules to the Superior Civil Service Rules. If this is accepted, --

Mr. Davies' pay will have to be treated as 'non-voted' with reference to Finance circular Memo. No. 32909 dated 6-11-25. With these remarks, the file may be sent to Finance u.o.
