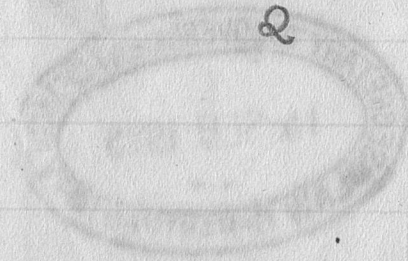
They were subsequently confirmed in

the third class while of school assistants' cadre (Rs. 75-5-100) holding the temporary posts. At the time of their confirmation, their initial pay was fixed under Fundamental Rule 22 at Rs. 100 plus 25 personal allowance; Rs. 100 plus 50 personal allowance; Rs. 100 plus 25 personal allowance and Rs. 100 plus 25 personal allowance respectively. This was also agreed to by the Accountant-General. But subsequently this personal allowance was objected to by the Auditor-General, vide G.O. No. 91 Law (Education) dated 23-1-1925.

I suggest the following answers:-

(a) Personal allowances were granted under Fundamental Rule 22. These allowances represented the difference between the pay drawn by the incumbents in their temporary posts and the maximum of the scale of pay in which they were confirmed.
