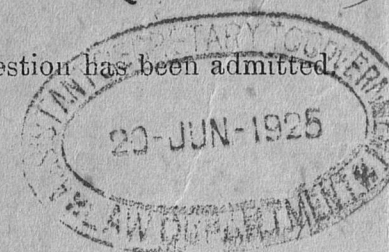

B.C. Reply No. 284/1925

In the three Government High Schools in KNV Malabar and in the Victoria College, Palghat, school department, Brennan College, Tellicherry, school department and the Government secondary and training school for women, Cannanore, there are three Indian Christian teachers employed, all in the last named school. The Deputy Inspectors in that district are either Brahmans or non-Brahmin Hindus. There are no Assistant Inspectors, these having been abolished some years ago. There are two Sub Assistant Inspectresses both of whom are Anglo-Indians. I have no information, however, in my office regarding secondary grade teachers employed in these schools. I am asking the D.E.O., Malabar, and the Inspectress to supply me with information on this point. As regards (c) of the question. The Director

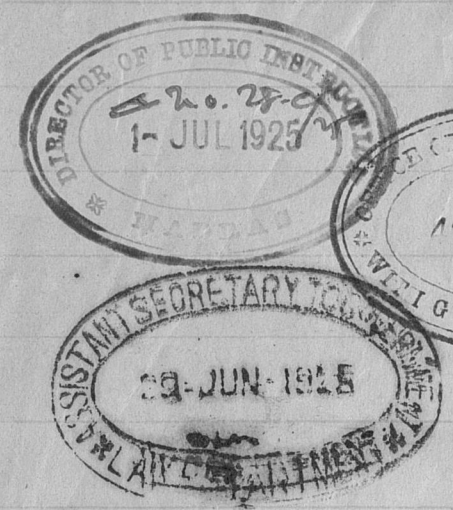

In the three Government High Schools in Malabar and in the Victoria College, Palghat, school department, Brennen College, Tellicherry, school department and the Government secondary and training school for women, Cannanore, there are three Indian Christian teachers employed, all in the last named school. The Deputy Inspectors in that district are either Brahmins or non-Brahmin Hindus. There are no Assistant Inspectors, these having been abolished some years ago. There are two Sub Assistant Inspectresses both of whom are Anglo-Indians. I have no information, however, in my office regarding secondary grade teachers employed in these schools. I am asking the D.E.O., Malabar, and the Inspectress to supply me with information on this point. As regards (c) of the question the probable

reason

reason for this small number of Christians employed is that qualified Indian Christians have not applied for or been available for Government service. If the Member who has asked the question will supply Government with names of qualified Indian Christians who desire employment under Government their claims will be considered on the occurrence of a suitable vacancy. The following answer is suggested:-

(a) Three, including one in the M.E.S. and two B.A., L.Ts, all in the women's branch, exclusive of secondary grade teachers regarding whom Government have no information;

(b) No Indian Christians have been appointed Deputy Inspectors of schools in Malabar. There are no Assistant Inspectors;

(c) If qualified Indian Christians applied for posts in Government service their claims will be considered.

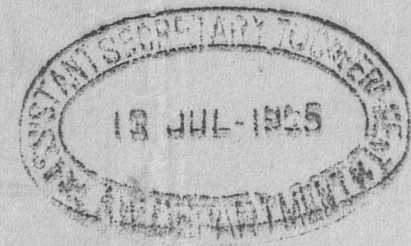
