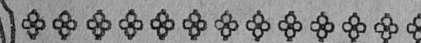

Whereas, a clause in the Madras Elementary Educa-
tional Act of 1920, Section 5, clause 6, declares that
any private educational body maintaining Elementary -
schools may/be given representation in the District Edu-
cational Council, I request you to give us at least
two representations in the said Council, considering
the following, when even the minor bodies are given -
representations in the Council.

In the district of Madras, we are maintaining -
several Elementary Schools Both higher and lower grade
according to the circumstances. Besides this, we have
several Hindu and Non-Hindu Girls' School, several -
Night Schools, besides some more schools in the Chin-
gleppt District. Further we have made efforts to open



one Industrial School and we have also applied for the same for approval.

So our system comprises a large number of institutions of different kinds, and at any rate ours exceed the number of schools, the Corporation has. When the Corporation has been given four seats, and the Teacher-Managers Associations, four, and one Night School - society has been given one seat, I think that we are right in demanding at least two seats as against the others.

We have several of our schools yet un-recognised and even for the schools that has been recently started, we have not applied for recognition as we - a big Educational body - has no one to represent us in the Council.

Under such circumstances, I request you to sanction us two seats in the District Educational Council, so that, to the present loyal service we are rendering to the Elementary Education, we may have good facility to do much for the same.

In resubmitting herewith the letter referred me for remarks in Government endorsement No. 3923 A-1, dated 20th October 1925, I have the honour to state that the District Educational Officers report that there are no elementary schools for boys (aided and unaided) run by the South Indian League either in the Madras city or in Chingleput. There are 11 unrecognised elementary schools for girls run by the League in Madras and Chingleput Districts together. The private agencies which have now been represented on the District Educational Council have got a number of recognised elementary schools under their management.

2. Under the proviso to section 5(b) of the Madras Educational Act of 20, any private educational body maintaining

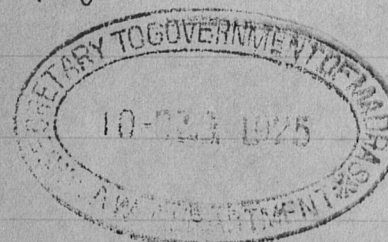
