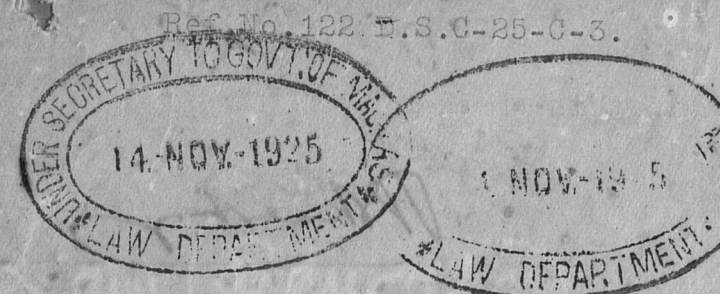

Military--Educational concessions--Nephew of ex-army man--Venkatasami Nayudu--Orders solicited.

One K. Venkatasami Nayudu, ex-sapper, Reservist, of the 2nd Queen Victorias Own Sappers and Miners residing at Chengulathupatti, Vadamadura Post, Dindigul Taluk, has applied to me for the educational concessions for his nephew R. Sundararajan, studying in the VI Form in the Union Christian High School, Madura.

Venkatasami Nayudu served in the army for 14 years 7 -- months and 11 days and he was discharged from the army on 30-6-1920 His conduct and character are 'exemplary' according to his discharge certificate.

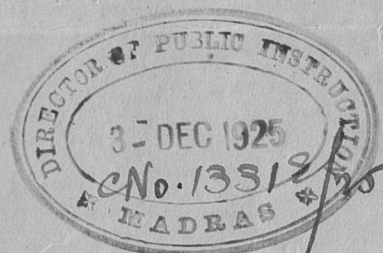
In G.O.No. 267 Law (Education) Department dated 19-2-25, Government declared that a nephew adopted as son by an ex-army man was eligible for educational concessions. In this case, the --- petitioner did not formally adopt his nephew as his son, but the boy has been under his protection, for the last eleven years and is dependant on the petitioner. This seems to be a case deserving of help.

I solicit the orders of Government as to whether ---

educational concessions may be allowed in this case.

Subject - Educational concessions for war service

From the resume at page 2 of G.O. No. 267 Ed, dated 19-2-25, it will be seen how the educational concessions which were primarily intended for the children of ex-army men came to be extended gradually to brothers and sisters ^{and the} adopted children of soldiers and to one nominee in the case of each soldier in Marumakkattayam families. The Collector of Madura brings to notice the case of an ex-army man's nephew who has not been formally adopted by the uncle but has been under his protection for the last ¹¹ ~~seven~~ years. The Collector says that the boy deserves help. It is submitted that unless 'adoption' is proved the grant of the concessions should not be authorised.

For orders.

The circumstances of the case seem Special. Eleven years of ^{continuous} sole support ~~has been~~ made by the boy's father, who is of the greatest interest of the man in the boy. We may authorise the Collector to grant the concession as a Special case. Col. supports the application. Public may see.

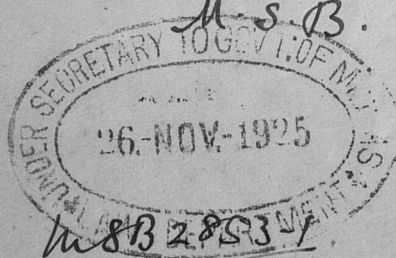
