Sir,

Reference G. O. no. 914 Mis. Law (Education)
Department dated 4th June 1924. - Indian Science Congress.

The Annual Science Congress begins its sessions at Bombay on the 4th January 1926 and continues for six days till the 9th. I propose to send my Botanical Assistant to attend the Congress. He is reading at the congress a paper on some foreign weeds recently introduced into the City of Madras. I request the sanction of Government for permitting him to attend the Sessions drawing a single railway fare of the class to which he is entitled for his journey to and ~~from~~ from Bombay and also the usual halting allowances admissible under the Madras Travelling Allowance Rules. The expenditure can be met from the provision for

travelling allowances for the current year available with me.

Similar sanction has been given in G.O. No. 23 Mis Law Education dated 7-1-1924.

2. If the Government has no objection I also propose to send my permanent Archaeological Assistant who is now engaged on special duty cataloguing the coins in the Museum to attend the Annual Meeting of the Numismatic Society of India which will be held in Bombay on the 16th and 17th January 1926. A copy of the letter from the Secretary, Numismatic Society of India, inviting him to attend the meeting is attached. I consider that his attendance there is desirable as the opportunity it will afford of meeting other Numismatists should help to widen his outlook on the subject on which he is now engaged. Moreover during the course of his cataloguing work he has come across certain coins on which further study can best be made in consultation with other members who attend the Annual Meeting. He also hopes to read a paper before the Meeting on gold coins that were recently found as treasure trove and acquired for this Museum. His work here is therefore likely to be much benefitted by his attending the Meeting. I hope that he may also be permitted to continue his stay there for three additional days to enable him to study the coins of the Bombay Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society. The travelling and halting allowances similar to those that are drawn by the Botanical Assistant will be drawn by him also and funds are available for the purpose in the provision for the travelling allowance for this year. I have therefore to request that sanction may be accorded for sending the Archaeological Assistant to attend the Meeting.

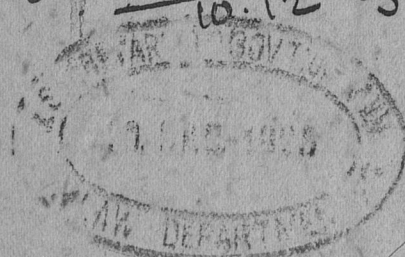
