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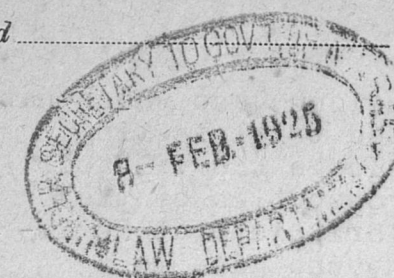

Sir,

I have the honour to address you as regards the
exemption from examination rules of N.T. Babu Rao, clerk, Dis-
trict Registrar's office, South Kanara.

2. The clerk has passed the Lower Secondary examination,
typewriting test in the elementary grade and the departmental
Registration Test. He has put in a service of nearly 14 years
in this department and possesses a clear record.

3. In a recent false personation case in South Kanara
district which ended in the conviction by the Sessions Judge
of two wealthy and influential accused to five and three years

rigorous imprisonment respectively, the clerk had rendered valuable help to the public prosecutor, thereby eliciting the following eulogy from him:

" In connection with the above Sessions Case which has just terminated after a protracted trial lasting over 12 days I cannot but acknowledge the valuable assistance given to me in the prosecution of the said case by Mr. N.T. Babu Rao, clerk, District Registrar's office, Mangalore. It is he who gave me a thorough insight into all the complicated facts of this intricate case and enlightened me on some points which but for him I should not have been able to fully understand. The trouble that he took in supplying me with all the necessary information as regards all the salient points at issue in this case considerably lightened my work. The success of this sensational trial must be attributed to a considerable extent to the great interest taken by him in bringing the offenders to book. He appeared to me a very intelligent and painstaking official and keenly zealous in the discharge of the duties entrusted to him."

The Registrar of South Kanara has also commended the clerk's work in connection with the said case as under:

" He has worked very hard with great self sacrifice of his time, energy even working far into the midnight and running out into dangerous errands in many cases at the risk of his life in the service of the department. I am personally aware of more than one instance in which his life was in danger. Especially in the P.D. Sadashiva Rao's false personation and forgery case where powerful influences were at the back of the defence which had support of money-legal and illegal assistance backed by influential persons and where even the police were wavering, the prosecution would not have succeeded but for the trouble, risk and out-time duties rendered by this clerk."

The case referred to is undoubtedly one of the most intricate cases that I have come across and from the enquiries made by me during my recent tour in the South Kanara district I am personally convinced that the prosecution would not have been successful against the powerful accused had it not been for the self-sacrificing and assiduous work of the clerk. I have also observed during my inspection of the District Registrar's office, South Kanara, in December last that the clerk has discharged his legitimate duties very satisfactorily and maintained the records in an excellent condition as Record Keeper of the Registrar's office. He possesses sufficient knowledge of English to be able to

satisfactorily discharge the duties of a Sub Registrar. Apart from the above facts the clerk belongs to the backward community known as Billavars and accordingly deserves encouragement.

5. N.T. Babu Rao's previous petition for exemption from examination rules was rejected by G.O.No.R.130, Law(Education), dated the 22nd March 1924, agreeably to my recommendation in Endt.No.26 Est. dated 7th idem. In consideration, however, of the invaluable services rendered by N.T. Babu Rao and the proof of his capacity given by him in this and other respects and as an incentive to other clerks who are plodding in the lower grades of service, I now recommend that he may be exempted from the provisions of Article 1 of the Public Service Notification with a view to his being appointed as an acting Sub-Registrar off and on and to his being eventually confirmed.
