Sir,

Educational concessions to the children of Indian
soldiers - G.O.No.1122 Law(Education) dated 17-8-1923

Dastagir Sheriff served in the Great War
as Lance Naick and was incapacitated on 7th January 1916
owing to wounds while on active service. His total service
in the Military Department was 6 years and 7 months. He
is getting a pension of Rs.9-12-0 a month. He is now
employed as a peon on Rs.15/- in the office of the Registrar
of Co-Operative Societies, Madras. As he has no children
of his own, he says that he has adopted his nephew as his
son, who is a student of the first form. He has applied
to me for the grant of educational concessions. Under the
G.O. quoted above the grant of concession to an adopted
son or a nephew does not seem to be permissible. I
therefore solicit the orders of Government in the matter
as to whether the prescribed certificate can be issued.

Educational concessions to children of ex-army men
Eligibility of adopted children -

Reference is solicited to Annexure I to G.O.No. 755 Public, dated 22-10-24 in which is given a list of the educational concessions sanctioned on behalf of the children and dependants of discharged soldiers. The concessions were primarily admissible to the children of such soldiers. Later on they were extended to Marumakathayam families, provided that the benefit was allowed to not more than one nominee in the case of each soldier. Further still, Collectors were authorised to extend the concessions at their discretion to the brothers and sisters of deceased and incapacitated soldiers if they were solely dependent on such soldiers and were left without other means of support. From the notes to G.O.No. 1340 Home (Education), dated 31-10-19 it will be observed that the scheme was intended to be applied in a liberal spirit. In this view, it seems that Collectors may be authorised to treat adopted children in the same manner as the children of soldiers. A draft order is submitted. It may be sent to Public for acceptance.
