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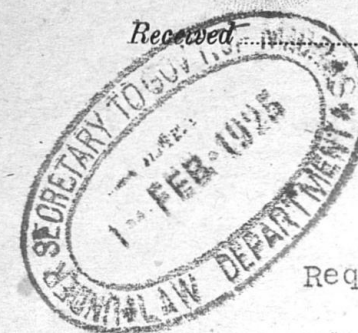

Sir,

With reference to G.O. No. 1212, Law (Education) dated 24th July 1924 publishing the revised draft of the Madras Educational Rules in Part I-B of the Fort St. George Gazette, dated 2nd September 1924, the Inspectresses of Girls' Schools were informed that concessions previously granted by the Director in respect of the rates of fees levied in secondary schools for girls under rule 69 of the Madras Educational Rules (V edition) would no longer hold good and that fees should be levied in accordance with rule 92 of the Madras Educational Rules (sixth edition) from 1st January 1925, if the rule had not already been given effect to.

2. The Inspectress, Central Circle, now reports that the introduction of the increased rates of fees in the Government Middle school attached to the Government Training School for Mistresses, Nellore, and in the Government Secondary school for girls, Vellore, threatens to reduce the number of girls in them and she therefore suggests that the old rates of fees which were hitherto levied, viz., one-fourth the standard rates, may continue for at least three years longer.

3. In the circumstances reported by the Inspectress <sup>of Government may be obtained</sup> I have the honour to request that the sanction for continuing the old rates of fees in the two schools until the end of the current scholastic year.

Subject: Levy of fees in girls' <sup>Secondary</sup> schools at one-fourth of the standard rates.

This is another instance which shows that the orders in G.O.No.759 Home (Education), dated 1st. July 1920, restricting the concession of half-fees to the poorer among girl pupils and pupils belonging to the Muhammadan and backward class communities were not given effect to by the Department. It is further observed that the Director had acted on old rule 69 (now rule 62) of the Educational Rules and authorised the levy of fees at one-fourth of the standard rates from the girls reading in the two institutions referred to in the Director's present letter. The rule in question no doubt gives power to relax in favour of girls' secondary schools the rules applicable to schools for boys of the corresponding grade. But this relaxation <sup>would extend to</sup> ~~only~~ to such matters as courses of studies, punishments, qualifications of teachers &c. So far as the levy of fees in girls' school is concerned, there has always been a specific rule on the subject <sup>at</sup> which authorised the levy of half fees from all girls till 1920. In 1920 the concession was limited to girls whose parents were poor. There was therefore no warrant for the Department to vary the rates of fees leviable from girls in any manner it chose.

2 The practice having been adopted and seeing that the current school year is almost over, it is for orders whether the Director's proposal to continue the levy of fees at the present
