Sir,

I am directed to state that an application was recently submitted by Mr. V.R. Adige for a Grant-in-Aid to enable him to complete his research work in Indian and Burmese Arts and Crafts. Mr. Adige who is a B.A. Honours of the Madras University, entered the University of Oxford as a Non-Collegiate Student in 1920 and obtained the B.Litt. degree in 1923. He then began an investigation of Indian and Burmese Arts and Crafts and in the course of his research has accumulated a considerable amount of material. Professor ^{Gilbert} ~~Douglas~~ Slater of the London School of Economics expressed the opinion that the work on which Mr. Adige was engaged was most useful, and Professor Rothenstein, Principal of the Royal College of Art, urged that all possible consideration should be given to Mr. Adige to help him with his "courageous and scholarly undertaking".

2. Mr. Adige has pursued the greater portion of his work in this country at his own expense, and as he would have been prevented, owing to lack of funds, from completing and publishing the work on which he is now engaged, which is likely to lead to a definite contribution of knowledge, I am to say that the High Commissioner has sanctioned a grant of £50 (Fifty pounds).

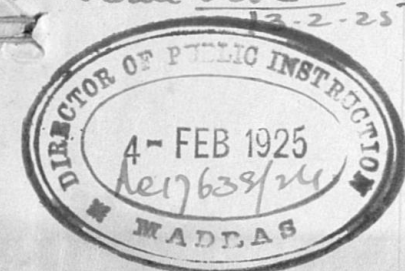

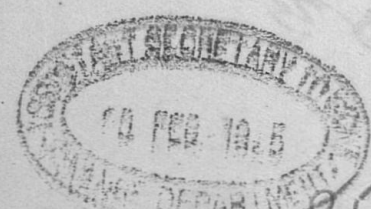

In the linked file the Director recommends the name of Mr. Adige for the grant of a post-graduate scholarship tenable in the United Kingdom. He also states that in the event of the Government approving his recommendation the grant-in-aid granted to the scholar by the High Commissioner need not be continued. The grant-in-aid already sanctioned has to be ratified. The scholar seems to be a deserving candidate. A draft letter to the High Commissioner is submitted. If approved, it may issue with the concurrence of Finance.

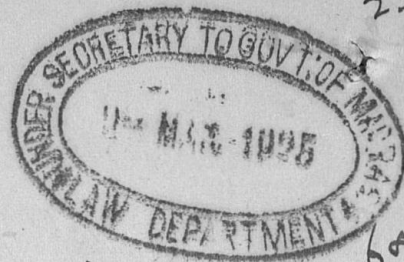
