The attention of the Government has been invited to the notification of the Principal, Teachers' College, Saidapet, at pages 1092 and 1093 of Part I B of the Fort St. George Gazette ^{d 23.12.24} in paragraph 9 of which it is said that / non-Brahman and Indian Christians will be provided with rooms, but ^{they} they will have to make their own arrangements for boarding. The Government desire that boarding facilities should be provided for non-Brahman and Christian teachers undergoing training as is the practice in the Victoria Hostel, Triplicane. Copy of letter R.C.No.28-D/25 dated 18-2-25 from the Principal in charge, Teachers' College, Saidapet.

Ref: Proceedings R.O.C.No.190-A/23 dated 14th February 1925.

I have the honour to submit the following report:-

At present the Hostel is working in eight different sections viz., (1) A general Brahmin Section consisting of 34 members, (2) A Malabar Brahmin Section with 11 members, (3) A Kanarese Brahmin Section with 10 members, (4) A general non-Brahmin Section with 13 members, (5) and (6) Two Nair Sections with 10 members and (7) and (8) Two Christian Sections with 20 members. Of these all except the first section manage their own affairs and run their own messes at their own request. The Hostel affords them facilities by lending them utensils, and in other ways. The members of these sections are exempted from the payment of the usual advance deposit of Rs.25/- and are required to contribute only a small portion of the salaries of the general establishment for services rendered.

2. The Hostel can make the necessary arrangements for the boarding of all members from the beginning of the next academic year, for which I am working out details in consultation with the Committee. It may be stated here that the members of the sections which are now managing their own affairs have also expressed a desire to be permitted to continue their existing arrangements for the rest of the current year.

3. A copy of the revised draft notification proposed to be issued in the future is herewith submitted for approval. On receipt of your orders any consequent revision of the Hostel rules that might be rendered necessary will be submitted in due course for approval.

9. There is a hostel attached to the College, which will provide board and accommodation for all communities.

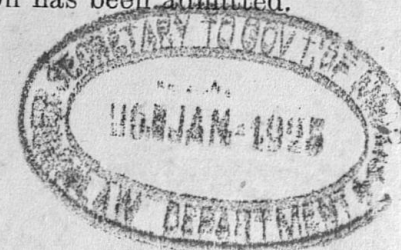

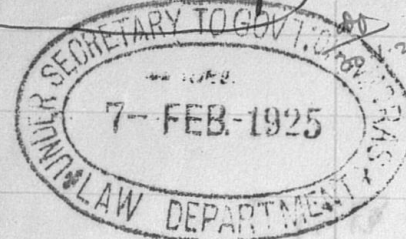
