Sir.

In continuation of my letter R.O.C.No. 3151-D/24 dated 27th February 1925 and 5th March 1925, I have the honour to submit for the orders of Government the case of a pupil named Pulakhandam Viswanatha Sastry who falls short of the prescribed minimum of 15 years by more than one year.

Pulakhandam Viswanatha Sastry, S.S.L.C.No. 67796 B is a pupil of the Board High School, Palakonda. His date of birth being 15-8-1911 he falls short of the required minimum ^{age} limit by one year 5 months and 15 days. The Medical certificate produced on his behalf testifies to his physical fitness to withstand the strain of the Public Examination. More-over ^{he} is found to be a pupil of more than average abilities (vide his marks at school in the long term 1924-25) The Headmaster of the

school strongly recommends the case for exemption being granted, and the District Educational Officer, Vizagapatam, also supports the Headmaster's recommendation. I consider that this is a deserving case and I accordingly recommend that the exemption may be granted.

2. The S.S.L.C. Book and the Medical certificate of the pupil are herewith enclosed for reference and return when done with.

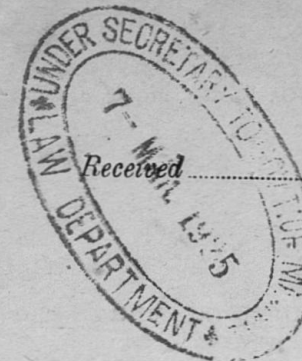
