Sir.

With reference to G.O.No. 60 Fis Law(Education) dated 17-1-25, I have the honour to report that the Special Officer appointed thereunder joined duty on 26-1-25 and the records of 20 taluks have so far been scrutinized as shown below:-

- 1) Guntur District 9 Taluks
- 2) Chittoor " 6 Taluks
- 3) Chingleput " 5 "

The records of each Taluk comprise the following:-

1. Consolidated Register prescribed in para 3 of the instructions approved in G.O.No. 916 Law(Education) dated 5-6-24.
2. The outline maps filled in according to para 5 of the instructions.
3. The appendices mentioned in para 6 of the

the Instructions.

2. In the course of the scrutiny, the centres or groups of centres not served by any existing school are marked in the consolidated Register received from the Educational Survey Officers. The ~~Secretary~~ ^{Scrutiny} has shown that the children of school-age residing in certain centres are not attending the schools which are within a mile or such centres. Since it is not possible to account therefor from the Taluk maps, which do not exhibit minor physical barriers, if any, between these localities, reference has to be made to the inspecting officers for reporting whether the opening of separate schools is necessary in such centres. It is also observed that there is an overlapping of schools in certain places due to the opening of board schools in centres which are served by aided schools. Suggestions are in such cases made to the inspecting officers for arranging in consultation with local bodies for the transfer of schools to centres which have no educational facilities. Again there are villages or hamlets on the borders of a taluk, the educational facilities of which may be served by schools in the villages of the adjoining taluks. Information on this point could not be had from the survey records and it has to be obtained from the local inspecting officers.

3. When the further particulars indicated above are received from the inspecting officers, a final list of the centres where new schools are required will be drawn up in the annexed form. I propose to send the list for each District when complete to the District Educational Officer with the request that it may be placed before the District Educational Council for careful consideration and report on the following points:-

1. Any modifications in the list including additions or omissions with reasons;

ii) whether private educational agencies are prepared to open schools in any of the centres, and if so, which and where; and

iii) whether the Taluk boards concerned are prepared to open, out of their funds, schools in any of the remaining centres, and if so, where.

4. On receipt of the Council's reply through the District Educational Officer, the question of advising the Taluk Boards concerned to levy the Education cess or to raise the rate of the cess, as the case may be, and of subsidising the local bodies to enable them to open new schools will be considered, and a report will be submitted to Government separately for each District. I request that Government will be pleased to approve of the procedure outlined above which is proposed to be adopted for scrutinizing the records and submitting a final report to Government on the subject.

5. Having in view, the nature of the statements and records to be scrutinized and tabulated for all the 214 Taluks in the Presidency and considering the rate at which the work has progressed so far, I am of opinion that the work will take at least six months to be completed. I therefore request that you will be so good as to obtain the sanction of Government to the continuance of the Special Officer for a further period of four months from 26-3-25.

6. Provision for the charge has not been included in the Budget Estimate for 25-26 as the expenditure was not foreseen at the time of its preparation. I shall however, submit a reappropriation statement, if necessary on receipt of Civil Budget Estimate for 25-26

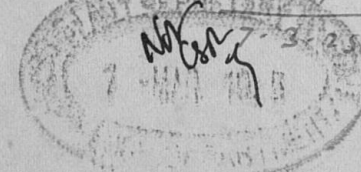

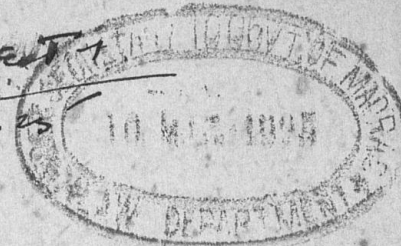

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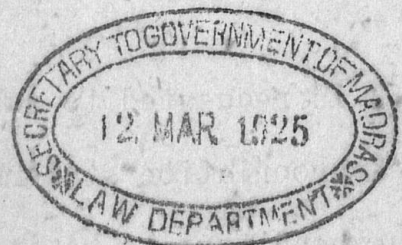
