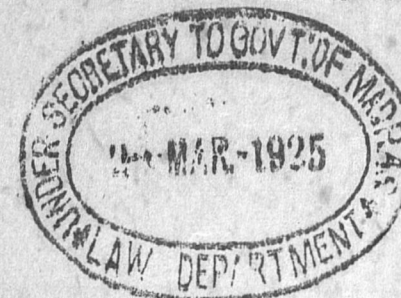

RESOLUTIONS.

(Adopted at the Annual Educational Conference, 7th February 1925)

- The Madras Teachers' Guild has learnt with deep regret of the sudden death of the Rev. D.C.M. Leith, one of the Vice-Presidents of the Guild. and this Conference places on record its appreciation of the valuable services he had rendered to the Guild. It begs to convey its sincere sympathy to Mrs. Leith in her bereavement.

- II. This Conference is of opinion that the practice of taking finger prints of students in the S.S.L.C. books be discontinued.
- III. Resolved that the Director of Public Instruction be requested to issue a circular that the medium of instruction in all non-language subjects in "Secondary Training Schools" should be the mother-tongue.
- IV. This Conference recommends to the Government that the standard of vernacular in the Secondary Schools stage be raised by the lightening of English therefor.
- V. This Conference recommends that in view of the distinct and separate interests which the teaching profession as such represents, the Government should provide in all representative institutions-such as Municipalities, Taluk and District Boards and the Madras Legislative Council, adequate representation to teachers.
- VI. This Conference requests the Government to appoint a Committee of the Legislative Council as suggested at the 16th Provincial Educational Conference held at Tinnevely in June 1924 to enquire into the conditions of service, security of tenure etc of the teachers in aided institutions.
- VII. Resolved that the paper on "Vernacular Equivalent of Scientific terms" read by Mr. K.S. Subramania Iyer be referred to the Mathematics and Science section of the Guild for further consideration.
- VIII. This Conference recommends that a school council on the lines laid down in the resolution passed at the Provincial Educational Conference held at Kumbakonam in 1922 be started in

each school with alterations to suit local conditions.

IX(a) This Conference expresses its sense of disapproval and indignation at the abrupt and sudden termination of tenure of the five teachers, formerly of the Hindu Union Committee School, (Choolai) without having recourse to the usual formalities incidental to the taking of such action, and conveys its sympathy to the teachers in distress.

(b). This Conference further expresses its sense of disappointment at the shyness and reserve ~~of~~ on the part of the Management to take (1) the public, (2) the parents and (3) the teaching profession into their confidence and do what they can to allay the anxiety and lull the ~~alarm~~ alarm naturally felt by the teaching world.

(c) It also recommends that the Guild in particular and the teachers in general should give relief to the distressed teachers (1) by enabling them to run and strengthen the Tutorial High ^{aid} School they have started, (2) by dispensing ~~with the~~ from the Co-operative Society of the Guild with suitable ~~and~~ safeguards, and (3) by urging members of the Guild and other friends of the profession to give ~~the~~ financial aid to the teachers thrown out of service in the shape of donations.

X. This Conference is of opinion that the Madras University Act of 1923 should ^{be} amended as to provide for a direct representation in the academic council of each of the vernacular languages in the Presidency of Madras, the representatives being returned by a common electorate of teachers engaged in the teaching of vernacular languages in the constituent and affiliated colleges.

XI. This Conference is of opinion * that it is desirable that teachers of over 3 years' standing who desire to qualify themselves for the higher examinations of the University of Madras be permitted to appear for the same without the production of attendance-certificates, and it requests the Vice-Chancellor to introduce necessary modifications in the Laws and Regulations.
