Children of Ex-army men - Educational concessions Major Burne's report

At Madura

Some complaints were received regarding the expense of educating children. The Govt. order under which the children of casualties may be educated free, and the children of others who served overseas in the War may receive education at half rates, or, if belonging to the backward classes at one quarter rate, does not appear generally to be known.

Hence at present many entitled to concessions are not receiving them.

At Sivakasi

At Periyakulam

Cases came to notice of children of ex-soldiers, some casualties on F. service, being charged, sometimes heavily, for schooling. Such cases are being represented to the local civil authorities.

At Dindigul

At Trichinopoly

It appears that in Trichinopoly also many are not yet receiving educational concessions, and that this is chiefly due to ignorance concerning them.

Govt. officials not below the rank of Deputy Tahsildars may grant exemption certificates, but these officials often have no means of discovering the children that are eligible. Also difficulties are experienced when the applicant for concession is a Gosha widow, who cannot interview the Deputy Tahsildar.

In this it seems that Hon. Correspondents can be

be of great assistance, particularly pensioned Indian Officers who can find out those eligible and co-operate with the deputy Tahsildars in obtaining the necessary certificates.

The Indian Officers Association is taking in hand the task of collecting names of all entitled to concessions laid down in Madras Government Order No. 755 dated 22-10-1924 throughout the District so that all eligible may participate. (S)

This will take some time to complete, and at present the concessions have not begun to take effect in all cases. However no particular difficulty is anticipated.

G.O.C's remarks

Questions relating to free education and land grants, in many cases, appear to date back some time and it is considered that a quick settlement of these questions would encourage and assist the ex-service men.

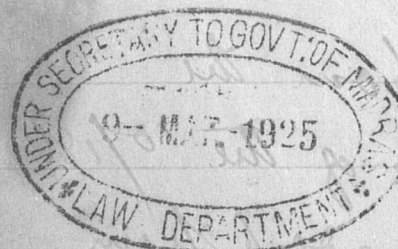

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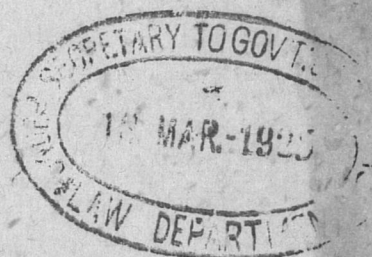
