Establishment of an Inter-University Board in India.

Sir,

I am directed to say that eleven out of the fifteen Indian

Universities having definitely agreed to join the Inter-University

Board recommended by the Indian Universities' Conference, arrange-

ments have been made in accordance with resolution No.48, for

convening the first meeting of the Board. The Provisional Committee

which was appointed, in pursuance of resolution No.47, suggested

that this meeting should be held in Calcutta. As, however, the

Calcutta University is unable at present to be represented on the

Board, it has been decided to hold the meeting in Bombay, from

the 23rd to the 25th March next, both dates inclusive, under the

auspices of the Bombay University, the most senior University among

the participants. I am accordingly to request that the

University may be moved to nominate one representative to attend the

meeting (,if it so wishes,) and the name of the representative may

be communicated to this Department (by telegram). (This representa-

tion will of course be without prejudice to the Senate's final

decision in the matter).

2. In compliance with the request made in resolution No.41,

the Government of India agree, as a special case, to defray on this

occasion the travelling expenses of the University representative

attending the meeting. Each representative will be granted travelling allowance at the rate of one and three-fifths first class railway fares each way and a halting allowance of Rs.10 a day for not more than three days.
