The Madura District Teachers' Guild. Resolutions adopted at Palni on 31-1-1925.

1. Mutual Contract between the Management and the Teacher.

(a) That it is advisable that there should be an understanding between the Management and the teachers of Secondary Schools regarding their terms of service which should be uniform throughout the Presidency and should form part of the Madras Educational Rules.

(b) That the Government be requested to introduce a standard scale of pay to be adopted by the Managers of all Secondary Schools in the Presidency as a condition of recognition under the Madras Educational Rules, since the Guild feels that no improvement in the existing condition of things will be effected until and unless a graded permanent and uniform scale of pay is enforced in all Secondary Schools throughout the Presidency.

(c) That all qualified teachers in any Secondary School whose services are continued for the second year shall be considered as permanent members of the staff, except when the post is temporary. That the probationary period shall not affect the teachers' participation in the Provident Fund.

(d) That except with the mutual consent of the Manager and the teacher no permanent member of the staff shall leave the institution at any time other than at the beginning of a school year, in which case notice shall be given not later than the 1st of May preceding. That no permanent member of the staff of a Secondary School shall be sent away by the Manager except for gross misconduct or neglect of work in which case notice shall be given with the sanction of the District Secondary Education Board by the 1st of April, the teacher concerned having the right of appeal to a Committee consisting of a nominee of the Department, a nominee of the management and a nominee of the aggrieved teacher.

(e) Any teacher who leaves an institution or is sent away after working in it for one academic year is entitled to be paid for the vacation.

2. Medium of Instruction.

The Guild strongly recommends that Headmasters of Secondary Schools do arrange for the teaching of Elementary Mathematics in the chief vernacular of the District in all the forms of the High School Department commencing from the next School year (July 1925) as a first step towards the teaching of non-language subjects in the vernacular.

3. Grants-in-Aid.

The Guild reiterates the resolution adopted at its last meeting held in October last in connection with the revision of the Grant-in Aid Code.

4. Text-books.

The meeting requests the S. S. L. C. Board (a) to reduce the portion in the S. S. L. C. text books, both detailed and non-detailed, and make them suited to the standard; (b) to publish the text-books in Tamil and Sanskrit much earlier.

5. Condolence resolutions.

The Guild regrets the demise of Dr. S. Subramania Iyer, the G. O. M. of Southern India, of Mr. C. Narayanaswami Iyer, Headmaster of the Sethupathy High School, Madura, and of the Rev. D. G. M. Leith of Madras, Educationist and social worker.

6. The Secondary Education Scheme.

The Guild requests that the Hon. the Minister for Education be pleased to send his new scheme on Secondary Education to the different Teachers' Associations in the Presidency for criticism and opinion.

7. Travelling Allowance for Delegates.

The Guild, while thanking the District Educational Officer and the Madura District Board for their generous lead in recommending and sanctioning travelling allowance to the delegates attending the regular meetings of the Guild requests that the District Board will be pleased to grant travelling allowance at least for two delegates from each School, and also requests the Managements of other Schools, both Aided and Municipal, to grant travelling allowance to at least two delegates from each of their institutions.

8. The Protection Fund Scheme.

That the rules of the Protection Fund as amended by the Special Committee be circulated among the different affiliated Associations in the District and their decision placed before the Managing Committee of the Guild, whose decision shall be communicated to the S. I. T. U. in the name of the Guild.
