It may be observed at the outset that the difference in the system of grants-in-aid for European and Indian schools was a subject of discussion during the last budget debate, and that the question of adopting the same rules in both the cases is now engaging the attention of the Director.

The M.L.C. who has given notice of the above motion asked recently ^{just an interpretation} ~~in connection with the~~ ^{asking for} ~~information~~ information as regards the systems of grants-in-aid adopted in the case of European and Indian schools. The following ^{answer} ~~information~~ was then furnished:-

" Grants-in-aid are not paid to European schools and or to Indian schools under a rate system. It is not therefore possible suitably to compare the rates of one school with the rates in another school.

" In the case of European schools, grants are given in the form of fixed grants under article 39 of the Code of Regulations for European schools and under the conditions laid down in appendix VIII to that Code, the main restriction being that the grant may not exceed the ordinary income of the institution from all sources other than Government grants. The system of aid in European schools is the same to all grades of school whether primary, middle or high.

" In the case of Indian schools the system of grants-in-aid to middle schools and high schools is that, subject to certain conditions, one-half of the net cost of maintaining the institutions be paid (vide the Grant-in-aid Code). The aid given in elementary schools is according to the rules laid ^{down} under the Madras Elementary Education Act.

" According to the most recent figures which have been worked out, the total of the fixed grant paid to European schools is less than one-half of their net cost. High schools obtained grants greater than one-half of their net cost, while middle and primary schools obtained grants less than one-half of ^{their} net cost."
