Law (Education) Dept.

The M. L. C. proposes to press for liberal grants to non-Government Arts Colleges. Grants to I grade colleges under private ~~and~~ management are disbursed by the Director under Chapter V of the Grant-in-Aid Code. The amount of grant for each college is determined by the Director after taking into consideration all the circumstances of the case. Grants to II grade colleges are assessed under the rules in Chapter IV of the Grant-in-Aid Code. As in the case of secondary schools, grants to these colleges represent one half of the net cost of the institution. These grants in both cases depend on the amount spent by the private management. The proportion of expenditure ~~now~~ met from Provincial funds (roughly 50%) has been considered to be equitable and has been in force for a long time. It is not known on what lines the ~~M.L.C.~~ *desires that the* system of aid now followed should be liberalised.

Increased provision has been made in the next year's budget for teaching grants to colleges and secondary schools as shown below:-

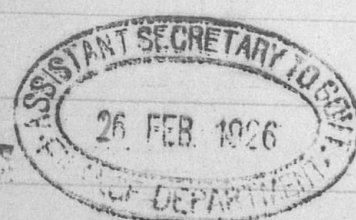
