as anticipated by Mr. Nunn, Principal of the London Day Training College

and the D.P.D., Mr. Muhammad has failed a second time in the London Teachers' Diploma examination last December.

According to the terms of the cablegram issued to the High Commissioner last October, Mr. Muhammad's Scholarship

should have been terminated immediately

his failure in the examination was announced. The High Commissioner now reports that he has given his careful consideration to the matter and

recommends that the Scholarship may be extended for a period not exceeding six months so as to enable Mr. Muham-

med to visit various schools in the United Kingdom and observe the methods of teaching and organization in them. There is provision in the budget for the continuation of the Scholarship till the 31st Aug. 1925.

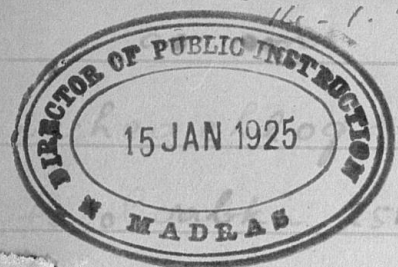
The only question is whether in view of the scholar's unsatisfactory performance till now, it is any use increasing further expenditure on him. It is evidently out of the question for him to secure a diploma.

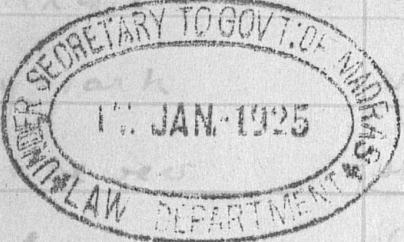

I fear that I am for the second time unable to endorse the recommendation of the High Commissioner. I consider that Government should cut its losses and order Mr. Muhammad to return to India expeditiously.

In view of the fact that he has obtained an honours degree in this University I should be prepared to appoint him in the subordinate educational service as soon as a suitable vacancy arises and have him deputed for training at the Teachers' College, Saidapet, at a subsequent date. England is clearly too much for him and he is dissipating his energies in that country.
