In acknowledging the G.O. No. 143, dated 30-1-1925,
I beg leave to submit the following:

Just as I was leaving Madras, I heard a rumour that my application was not likely to be entertained as doubts were expressed in certain quarters that the Triposes I have taken, (Section A of English, and Part II of Economics) are not complete. I did not take this rumour seriously, for the reason that these Parts are not only not incomplete, but those recommended by the University, and actually taken up by students in numbers increasing from year to year. Sir A. Quiller-Couch, the King Edward VII Professor of English at Cambridge, always emphasised on the "Sections A & B" (not Parts I & II, as in the case of the other Triposes) of the English Tripos, and used to say that he emphasised like that, because "the principle of the two-fold division in the English Tripos is different." This fact has been officially recognised too. "It is to be observed that the two Sections of this Tripos (English Tripos) are not on the same footing as the Parts into which other Triposes are divided." -- this statement is to be found in the "Students Handbook published by the University (p. 410 of the issue for 1920-21)." Section A is a comprehensive course in Literature, and section B a like course in Philology. In all decent institutions Literature and Philology are found to be taught invariably by two separate individuals.

In the other Triposes, Part II is a necessary complement of Part I. So, if I had taken only Part I of the Economics Tripos and left it there, surely the course would

have been incomplete. But I took Part II of that Tripos. An examination of the Syllabus for that course will show that it is a natural and very valuable supplement to the work that a student does for his History and Economics papers of the B.A. examination (which I have passed) of the Madras University. If I may be permitted to add that much, I wish also to submit that, for Part I of the Economics Tripos, a student covers much the same ground as he covers for -- Group V of the B.A. pass course of the Madras University.

I feel it my duty to my University and to myself that I place these facts with due submission before you.

The G.O. which mars my future was evidently passed (if the rumour is true), without taking these facts into consideration. I respectfully request that the Government may therefore be pleased to reconsider it.

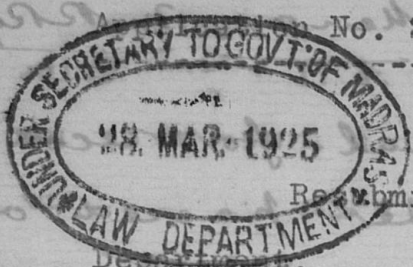

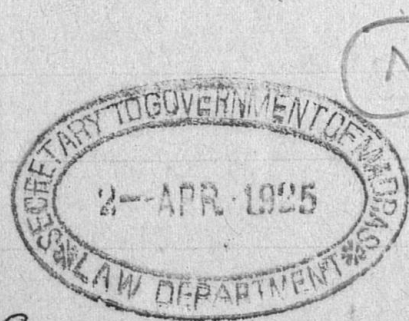
