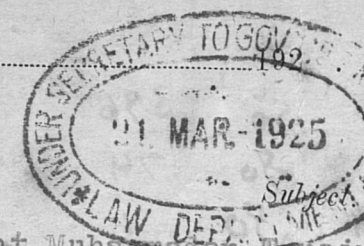

Sir.

As the sanction accorded in G.O.No. 414 Misc., Law (Education) dated 18th March 1924 to the retention for a further period of one year of the Government Muhammadan Training school, Arcot, expires on 30-4-25, I have the honour to request that in the circumstances explained hereunder, Government will be pleased to sanction the permanent retention of the school together with the staff and establishment employed therein with effect from 1-5-25.

2. The school caters mainly to the needs of North Arcot, South Arcot, Chittoor and Cuddapah districts. As there is no other separate training school for the training of Muhammadan teachers in the districts South of Madras, teachers from Madura, Trichinopoly, Salem and Coimbatore districts also seek admission into it. The number of teachers now under training in the school is 56 (19 Seniors and 37 Juniors) and the District Educational Officer reports that the probable strength in 1925-26 will be 77 (40 Juniors and 37 Seniors). The number of students trained in each class since 1916 when the institution was first started is as follows:-

These statistics clearly indicate that the institution meets a real want and that it has justified its existence. In these circumstances and in view also of the fact that the institution including the hostel has been provided with a suitable Government building, I recommend that it may be permanently retained. I may remark in this connection that ultimately with progress in Muhammadan Education in this Presidency, it will be found possible to open a Higher Elementary Section in connection with the school and thus raise its status to the Higher Elementary grade.

3. With the permanent retention of the school it will be necessary to include, for the sake of uniformity, the post of the Headmaster in the cadre of School Assistant, and I request Government to sanction the inclusion of the post in that cadre with effect from 1-5-25.

4. Provision for the salary of the staff and establishment employed in the school has been inserted

3. in the Budget estimate for 1925-26, the pay of the Headmaster at Rs.93 $\frac{3}{4}$ and the pay of the remaining members in accordance with the scale sanctioned for each.

5. The extra expenditure involved by the proposal contained in para 3 above will be Rs.12 $\frac{1}{2}$ during 1925-26, which can be met from the anticipated savings in the provision under

in the Budget estimate for that year. The extra average annual expenditure involved by the proposal will be Rs.153 $\frac{3}{4}$ (monthly average pay of the Headmaster 106 $\frac{1}{2}$ - the present pay 93 $\frac{3}{4}$) x 12 months.

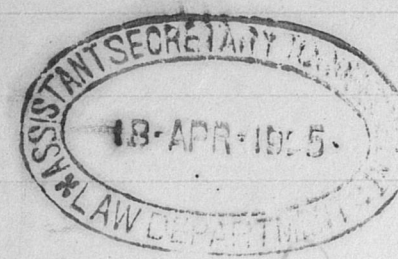

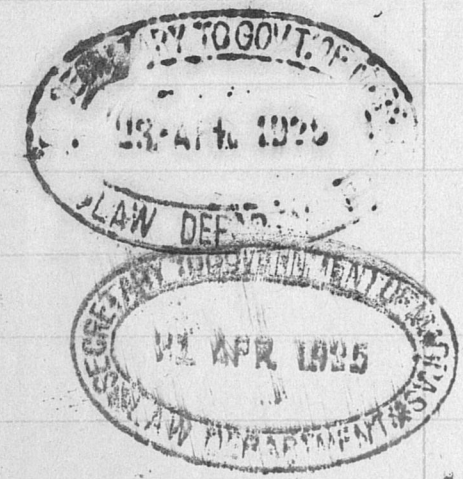
