mercial education is dealt with in 'Education'. The Government maintain two institutions namely, the Institute of Commerce, Madras and the School of Commerce, Calicut. The former is intended mainly to coach students for the Accountancy Diploma Examination of the Bombay Accountancy Board a pass in which followed by a period of apprenticeship ^{-ship} qualifies candidates for the auditing profession. It also prepares students for the various ^{Govt.} Technical Examinations. The Calicut school also prepares students for these examinations. To meet the needs of commercial education in the northern districts, the Government have included in the next year's budget a provision of Rs 13,200 for opening a similar school in that part of the Presidency. In the field of commercial education there are a number of private institutions and ~~their~~ they are so plentiful that there is no need for Government aid. The following institutions are, however, aided by the department:-

1. the Y.M.C.A., School of Commerce,
2. the Pudupet Convent School of Commerce, Indian section.
3. the V.W.C.A., School of Commerce.
