(To speak about the Adi Dravida Training and about the rate of stipends)

Law (Education) Department

Mr. Raja might apparently desire to talk about the amalgamation of the Adi-Dravida Training school with the Triplicane Training School which was given effect to in 1923. The amalgamation was effected on grounds of economy and efficiency. It may be explained that the amalgamation is in consonance with the general policy of Government of providing equal facilities for the Adi-Dravida and the caste Hindu in schools under public management, that in the present instance the building of the Adi Dravida Training School had to be given over to the Industries Department for their Trades School and that the amalgamation of the schools has resulted in economy of rent and other contingencies and staff. Mr. Raja obviously apprehends that by the amalgamation facilities for the training of Adi Dravidas have been curtailed. The D.P.I. in supporting the proposals pointed out that the clubbing together of the schools will not lead to this result and in the anxiety to retain uncurtailed the facilities for the training of Adi Dravida teachers the lower elementary classes have been duplicated. A comparison of Adi Dravida teachers trained in the institution shows that while there were 52 such teachers under training prior to the amalgamation of the school, their num-

ber after the amalgamation rose to 66.

Stipends

Mr. Veerian recently interpellated the Government why a stipend of Rs 10-8-0 should be paid to Muhammadan teachers and Hindu mistresses of the lower elementary grade undergoing training while teachers of the corresponding grade belonging to the depressed classes should get only a stipend of Rs 9-8-0. He also pleaded for the extension of the system of guardian allowances to mistresses belonging to the depressed classes undergoing training. ^{Mr. Raja may also allude to this.} The Government have recently obtained a report from the D.P.F. and the question of removing the differential treatment is under consideration.
