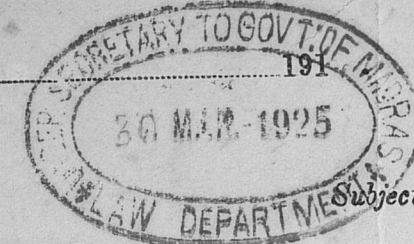

Sir,

I have the honor to invite a reference to G.O.No.164 Law (Education), dated 4th February 1925 issuing instructions in regard to the grant of increments in the time-scales of pay to clerks who are not qualified under Article 1 of the Public Service Notification and to place for the orders of Government the cases of two clerks of this office.

Mr. G. Srinivasa Ayyangar and Mr. Manikka Mudaliar were appointed

appointed permanently to the posts of Notice Clerk and Accountant respectively which carried a pay of Rs.20/- on 1st January 1912 and 2nd October 1912, to be appointed to which posts, no educational qualifications were required at the time. When the pay of the clerical and menial establishments was revised in G.O.No.905, Judicial, dated 20th April 1914, the pay of these two posts was not raised, but Government were pleased to sanction a personal allowance of Rs.3/- to each of the clerks.

The minimum remuneration payable to a clerk being raised to - Rs.35/- (Vide G.O.No.146, Financial, dated 18th February 1920) these two incumbents were allowed to draw a temporary local allowance of Rs.12/- from 1st February 1920 which was subsequently treated as temporary local additions to their pay from 1st April 1920, counting for pension (Vide G.O.No.780, Financial, dated the 28th August 1920). On the introduction of the time-scale of pay from 1st March 1921, their initial pay was fixed at Rs.40/- and the increments earned on 1st March 1923 and 1st March 1924 for approved service were sanctioned. Their present pay is Rs.43/- and their work continues to be satisfactory.

In the above circumstances, I have the honor to recommend that Government may be pleased to exempt the above named two clerks from Article 1 of the Public Service Notification so as to enable them to draw further increments in their time-scale. Pending orders of Government the increments

increments earned by them on 1st March 1925 are held in abeyance.
