The amount specified in Mr. Rama Rao's motion is the total provision for Govt. Secondary schools for boys and girls under 'Transferred - voted'

This section of the budget includes only a provision of Rs. 1,400 for the medical inspection of pupils in Government Secondary schools for boys and no provision at all for Govt. Secondary schools for girls. As to the latter it may be observed that the Government do not propose to bring girls' schools under inspection at present. The question will presumably be considered after some experience is gain-

ed of the working of the system in boys' schools.

As to the inadequacy of the provision, the Hon'ble member is apparently under the impression that the sum of Rs.1,400 constitutes the entire allotment for next year for medical inspection. It may be pointed out to him that the Government have provided for a sum of Rs. ^{12,900} ~~12,850~~ for the purpose distributed as follows under the several minor heads relating to Education:-

Secondary schools for boys and ^{of teachers under training in all} Training schools for masters and that, so far as non-Govt. institutions are concerned the next year's provision is limited to one-third of the number ^{pupils in} of such schools, as it is not anticipated that during the first year more than this number ^{would} ~~be~~ ^{undergo} ~~medical inspection~~.
 2. Mr. Venkatarama Ayyangar wants to raise the question of policy. The need for medical inspection has been

long recognised and if the Hon'ble ~~the~~ member wants to have the details it may be mentioned that as soon as the budget is passed the details of the scheme will be embodied in a Government order and published.
