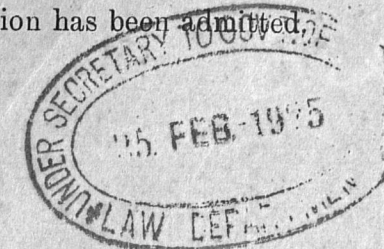

THE LAW (Education) DEPARTMENT.

730. Will the hon. the Minister for Education
be pleased to state the Government assured con-
trol (a) the reasons for the amalgamation of the
Secondary Training School at Tiruvalur with
the Elementary Training School at Tanjore;
(b) how far the union of the two schools
has been effective in maintaining the effi-
ciency of the two schools;
(c) whether it is a fact that the
excellent work and the good reputation of
each school before the amalgamation have been
shattered after the amalgamation of the
schools;
(d) whether the poor condition of the school
is due to the inability of the new head-
master who is new to the work in Secondary
Government High School, Tiruvalur to the District
Training School; and
(e) whether the assistants of the school
was under consideration of Government, the D.P.
protested against the unmannerly action of
the head-master?
Tiruvalur might be shifted back to Tanjore and
amalgamated with the Higher Elementary Training
school at that place. He stated that facilities
for the practical work of the students under train-
ing would be more satisfactory at Tanjore than at
Tiruvalur as there was a complete higher elementary
school at Tanjore with standards I to VIII. He
also stated that in the combined school it would be
possible to provide for specialists in each of the
important subjects of instruction and that the
arrangement would be more economical and efficient.
The amalgamation of the schools was recommended
in G.O. No. 701 Law (Education), dated

Clause (a) of the question.

Prior to 1919 the Tiruvalur High School was under the management of the District Board, Tanjore. In that year the Government assumed control of the school in pursuance of the model high school scheme which had as its aim the establishment of a certain number of Government high schools in the Presidency to set the standard for secondary schools under private management and provide the requisite facilities for practical instruction in educational methods. The secondary training class at Tanjore, which formed part of the Higher Elementary ~~any~~ Training school at that place was removed to Tiruvalur and attached to the high school there, the classes (Class V to Form III) in the high school ~~the~~ serving as the practising section for the students under training.

2. In April 1924 when the retransfer of the Government High School, Tiruvalur, to the District Board, Tanjore, or the Municipal Council, Tiruvalur, was under ^{the} consideration of Government, the D.P.I. recommended that the secondary training school at Tiruvalur might be shifted back to Tanjore and amalgamated with the Higher Elementary Training school at that place. He stated that facilities for the practical work of the students under training would be more satisfactory at Tanjore than at Tiruvalur as there was a complete higher elementary school at Tanjore with standards I to VIII. He also stated that in the combined school it would be possible to provide for specialists in each of the important subjects of instruction and that the arrangement would be more economical and efficient. The amalgamation of the ~~the~~ two schools was approved in G.O. No. 761 Law (Education), dated 12-5-1924.

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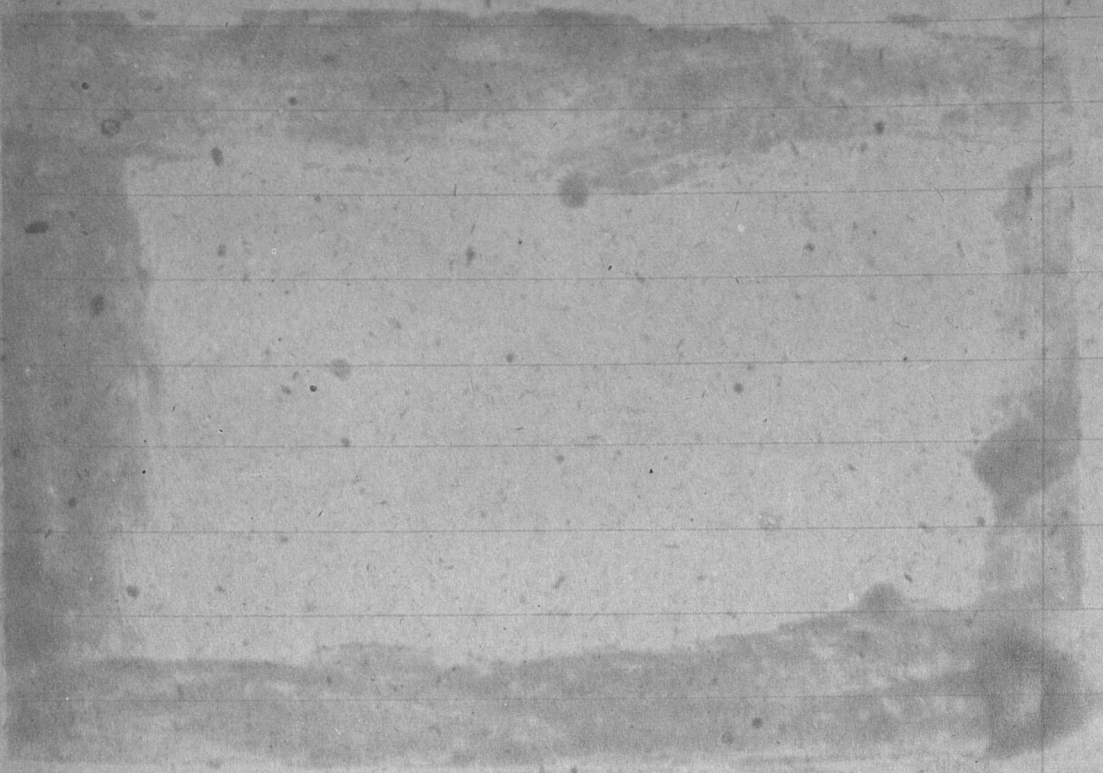
