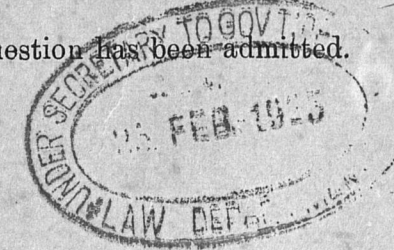

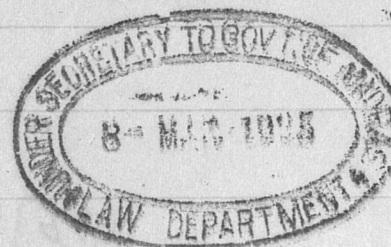

I received a report on the Government Training School, Tanjore, on the 19th December last. The report revealed an unsatisfactory state of affairs and I am requiring the D.E.O. to investigate matters further and to submit a report by the end of this month. On receipt of this further report I shall take such action as appears to be necessary to improve the efficiency of the school. I may remark as regards (b) of the question that what the D.E.O. actually stated was that 'nearly half a lac of Government money is being spent annually on the school and it was but right that the department should expect a better return for the huge sum spent'. Presumably Mr. Satyamurti has been given a garbled account of what the D.E.O. has stated in his inspection report though it is not known how he was in a position to know what was stated in the report at all. The D.E.O. states that 'the poor condition of the school is not due to any lack of effort on the part of the headmaster who has been there only a short term, viz., from the reopening of the school from after the summer vacation'.
